

Virtual AFCA Meeting: Pedestrian and Traffic Safety

AFCA invites you to join our monthly meeting on Wednesday, April 16, 7 p.m., through Zoom. Experts on our local pedestrian, biker, and traffic safety issues will talk about what our neighborhood is doing to work with the county and with other citizens' associations to reduce incidents and accidents. We will also have a discussion on Arlington's tree canopy and the GetGreen app. In addition, Arlington Forest's representative in the Arlington County Civic Federation, Eric Lotke, will summarize CivFed's position on a recently proposed bill (HB 2768) to change the composition of the Arlington County Board and to introduce single-member districts.

AFCA March 2025 Meeting By Char Mahoney, Recording Secretary

On March 19, AFCA President Sal D'Itrio introduced several speakers (Cheryl Roesel, Bev Johnston, Janet Irwin, and Susan Graham), who presented the benefits of gardening with native plants. The ecological benefits include supporting insects, which pollinate 90% of the Earth's flowering plants; our native oaks alone support more than 500 species of moths and butterflies. Climate change, habitat loss, and pesticide use are devastating ecosystems, and native plant gardening is a way to combat them.

Practical tips for starting a native plant garden include replacing a small portion of lawn with native plants to get started. You simply cover the area with cardboard and mulch and allow the grass to decompose. You can choose native plants for a variety of conditions (sunny, shady, damp, dry, and so on); moreover, natives can coexist with other plants, and you don't need (and shouldn't use) fertilizer. The Plant Nova Natives guide is a helpful resource for selecting native plants suited to conditions in our area (see https://www.plantnovanatives.org). The National Wildlife Federation's Native Plant Finder lists local native plants by zip code (see https://nativeplantfinder.nwf.org). The Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation's Virginia Native Plant

Finder site allows searches by plant name and characteristics (see https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/natural-heritage/native-plants-finder). The Northern Virginia Bird Alliance's Wildlife Sanctuary Program offers advice on creating wildlife sanctuaries in your yard (see https://www.nvbirdalliance.org/wildlife-sanctuary-program).

It's important to make sure that plants are native to our area so they can maximize their benefits to pollinators. Conventional nurseries can carry plants labeled "native" that are not native to our area, and "nativars" (cultivated varieties of native plants) can have reduced value for our local insects. Local vendors specializing in native plants include the Virginia Native Plant Society's

sales in Alexandria (first Wednesday of each month starting in April); the Northern Alexandria Native Plant Sale (April 26); Green Spring Garden Day in Alexandria (May 17); the Nature by Design nursery (see https://www.nature-by-design.com); and the Earth Sangha nursery (see https://www.earthsangha.org/wpn). You can join the Arlington Forest Gardening listsery by sending an email to AFGardens+subscribe@groups.io.

A discussion followed on how to keep deer and other animals out of your garden. Excluding deer with an 8-ft fence might be necessary, especially near parks. Native plants like spicebush, pawpaw, and river birch are deer resistant.

Faces of the Forest: The Lotke/Mortimer Family in Northside By Christiana Campos

Even on the rainiest days, the butterflies, vibrant flowers, and hungry caterpillar painted on the exterior of the Lotke/Mortimer family home bring sunshine and warmth to all who pass by. The stunning mural envelops this unique four-bedroom, three-and-a-half bath brick colonial with nature's most beautiful splendors.

Eric Lotke and Amy Mortimer moved to the DC area from Connecticut in 1994 and began their quest to become first-time homeowners in 1996, when they learned they were expecting their first child, Isaac (now 28 and at Georgetown Law School). They aimed for settling into a new house by spring 1997, then found their lovely Arlington Forest home in December 1996, months ahead of their nesting schedule! They fell in love with the house's close proximity to trails, parks, the community center, and Ballston with its metro.

Eric and Amy purchased the house from children of the original owners and, according to Eric, received a "gift" during closing: the paperwork from the home's sale to the original owners in 1939. The papers revealed that the house originally sold for \$8,000 (including an additional \$800 fee for a fireplace!) in a year when the buyer earned \$10,000. (The \$8,000 cost of the original home in 1939 would be about \$184,000 today, a small fraction of today's home prices in Arlington Forest.)

Two years after they moved in, Eric and Amy welcomed their second child, Marika, now 26 years old and working with the Peace Corps in the

Dominican Republic. In 2002, they decided to amplify the original home by adding a top floor above their existing addition, as well as an uber-cool loft to chill, decompress, and absorb views of the outdoors. During construction, they found signatures on the beams from the original construction crew, so they followed suit and had their own construction crew sign their names before adding the drywall.

In 2018, the house was in need of an exterior paint job. Coincidentally, Eric and Amy were dreaming of creating a one-of-a-kind mural using their home as a canvas. Little did they know that the painter they settled on, Langston Urrutia, was an artist on the side whose true passion was drawing and creating artwork. Langston offered his original art consisting of two larger-than-life monarch butterflies, a caterpillar crawling up the chimney, and dandelions and sunflowers as a mural on the home's white exterior. The house is now known locally as the "Butterfly House" and has been featured on local blogs and websites.

By day, Eric works at the National Education Association in Washington, DC, and bikes to work



"unless it's snowing, icy, or pouring down rain." Outside of work, he is an activist, scholar, and published author. One of his novels includes a pizzeria that was named after our own local Bricks. Amy, his "forever girlfriend," works with Opportunity@Work, an organization that advocates for accomplished workers who are overlooked for higher wage jobs because they have no bachelor's degree. Additional Safety Improvements Coming to Carlin Springs Road

AFCA is once again partnering with the Bluemont Citizens Association (BCA) to improve pedestrian safety and encourage safer driving behavior on Carlin Springs Rd. The BCA gained approval for the exploration of intersection improvements along N. Carlin Springs Rd. between 2nd St. N. and N. Galveston St. through the

county's Arlington Neighborhoods Program (ANP). Proposed plans include permanent corner curb extensions; an updated crossing at N. Harrison St.; and bus stop upgrades within the proposed project area.

Homeowners adjacent to specific safety improvements will soon be contacted by representatives of the ANP to indicate their approval/disapproval of the proposed upgrades. At least 60% of affected property owners must approve the project in order for final design development to proceed. The AFCA and BCA have submitted letters of support to the ANP for the project. Please note that survey crews are expected to be in the project area in the coming weeks to collect site information. Please be sure to be safe when driving and give them a brake.

The Lubber Run Farmers Market began its eighth season on April 5. The market, in the Barrett Elementary School parking lot at 4401 N. Henderson Rd., will be open every Saturday, rain or shine, from 8 a.m. to 12 noon through November 22.

The market welcomed seven new vendors this year. Big Boy Biscuits and Good Company Doughnuts bring new breakfast options that will pair nicely with Harvest Hue's 100% natural, cold-pressed juices. For snacking, choose from several flavors of POPcorn Perfected, airpopped fresh at the market! Or add cow's milk cheeses from Village Cheeseworks to your cheese board to complement the goat's milk cheeses from returning favorite Faerie Springs Farm. 

News Bits

New Traffic Signal

Since completion of the new Lubber Run Community Center in 2020, the intersection of N. George Mason Dr. with N. Park Dr. in Arlington Forest has seen an uptick in crashes. Arlington County has installed a new four-way traffic light at the intersection, with plans for finalizing it this spring. The intersection is also getting curb extensions on all corners, increased street lighting, and marked crosswalks.

Spring Celebration on April 19

Get ready for Earth Day (April 22) and Arbor Day (April 25) at the annual Spring Celebration and Plant Sale at the Glencarlyn Library Garden on Saturday, April 19, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Nature-related activities and products will be available, sponsored by the Master Gardeners of Northern Virginia. An educational tree walk will start at 1 p.m., and the Small Trees Make Big Canopies program will be giving away saplings during the event.

Northern Alexandria Native Plant Sale

You will find native perennials, shrubs, and trees for sun or shade! Ten or eleven vendors from Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania will be at this annual event, the largest native plant sale in the metropolitan region. It's on Saturday, April 26, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., in the parking lot of The Church of St. Clement at 1701 N. Quaker Lane. Parking in Christ the King's parking lot, across the street on Oakcrest, will be allowed this spring. Vendors are listed on the sale website at www. NorthernAlexandriaNativePlantSale.org.

Arlington Deer Drone Survey

The Department of Parks and Recreation conducted its second deer population aerial drone survey on March 17-21. The data will guide the county's deer management strategies, reducing overpopulation and protecting native plant communities. The survey covered all of Arlington except for Federal lands. Technologies included thermal imaging, visual spectrum imagery, and GPS for precise data collection. The Federal Aviation Administration and other federal agencies reviewed and approved the survey, which used low-resolution imagery to ensure privacy.

Georgetown Assists Fired Feds

In March, Georgetown University began offering resources to federal public servants who have lost—or might lose—their jobs. Support includes scholarships for tuition reduction and career resources for recently separated federal employees. You can find out more online at Georgetown University Federal Workforce Transition.

Reporting Stream Pollution

With spring here, cleanup activities can lead to dangerous chemical spills into our local streams. If you notice illegal discharges discoloring streams in our neighborhood parks, you can report it at www.arlingtonva.us/Government/Topics/Report-Problem. They will not be able to respond outside of business hours, but they will investigate and get back to you. You can find out more online at Report Stream Pollution Arlington.

Ravens Nesting Again

A pair of ravens has nested in recent years on a support for the Route 50 bridge over Four Mile Run in Glencarlyn Park. The common raven looks like an American crow, only bigger, and it has a deeper call resembling a croak. Though native to Virginia, ravens have a home range largely restricted to the Appalachians, so having a local nesting pair is new. You can see the nest from the W&OD Trail on the far support for the bridge, where you might also see the raven pair—and, in time, the chicks.

Dog Leash Law

By law, Arlington requires dog owners to keep their pets on leashes while out in public. Even a "good dog" let off leash in a park can be injured by cars, wild animals, or other dogs, and unleashed dogs can frighten passersby. Arlington's 10 dog parks are for letting dogs run free, including the Glencarlyn Dog Park in Glencarlyn Park (with access through the road to the Long Branch Nature Center); anywhere else, the owners of dogs off leash can be fined.
