## Busy Agenda for March AFCA Meeting

The March AFCA meeting will feature an update on planning for the 2020 season of the Lubber Run Farmers Market and a presentation on the growing deer population. There will also be short updates on the AFCA Home and Garden Tour, the County's Missing Middle Housing study, and the AFCA Neighborhood Conservation Plan survey. The meeting is on Wednesday, March 18<sup>th</sup>, at 7 PM in the Barrett Elementary School library.

Barbara Englehart of the Lubber Run Farmers Market committee will discuss plans for the 2020 season. The market, open Saturdays 8 a.m. to noon in the Barrett Elementary School parking lot, reopens April 11<sup>th</sup> and runs through November.

Also on the agenda is a presentation about the growing deer population by Bill Browning of the Arlington Regional Master Naturalists. Virginia's White-Tailed Deer were almost driven to extinction a century ago, but their numbers are so high today that they are destroying habitat for other wild-

life. In this presentation, we will learn how this population cycle has occurred, and what it means for our parks, forests, and neighborhood. We will also hear about how some of our neighboring jurisdictions have chosen to approach the problem.

Please see elsewhere in this newsletter for updates on other important neighborhood issues. Below is an article alerting you to a special AFCA meeting on April 1<sup>st</sup> with County Board Member Christian Dorsey who will discuss a County initiative that could rezone neighborhoods like ours to allow single-family houses to be torn down and replaced by duplexes or triplexes. On page 2 is an invitation for you to complete an online survey to guide AFCA in updating our Neighborhood Conservation Plan. On page 3 is an update on AFCA efforts to get the County to repair the extensive damage in Lubber Run Park caused by last March's flood. Finally, on page 4 is an update on planning for the AFCA Home and Garden Tour set for May 2<sup>nd</sup>.

## How Will New County Study Affect Arlington Forest's Future?

County Board Member Dorsey to Speak to AFCA About Allowing Different Types of Housing in Single Family Neighborhoods

Arlington County Board Member Christian Dorsey will be the speaker at a special Arlington Forest Citizens Association meeting on April 1<sup>st</sup> at 7 PM in the Barrett Elementary School library. Dorsey will be discussing a newly launched County initiative: The Missing Middle Housing Study.

Why is this important to our neighborhood? The study will explore whether reducing barriers to building duplexes, triplexes and other types of housing in areas now zoned exclusively for single family homes – like Arlington Forest — could address Arlington's limited housing supply. Under consideration is allowing more than one residence per lot (called upzoning).

While some County Board members have said that the County Board is currently not considering upzoning the entire County, selected neighborhoods, such as Arlington Forest could be prime candidates, resulting in increased density and encouraging tear downs to build multiple units on one lot.

### Neighborhood Conservation Survey

Arlington Forest is holding a neighborhood survey as part of updating our neighborhood conservation plan. You can take the survey now! It should take about 15 minutes of your time.

Our neighborhood conservation plan, dating to 1991, badly needs an update. Our revised plan will let us participate in Arlington County's Neighborhood Conservation Program, with projects to beautify and otherwise improve our neighborhood. Those Arlington Forest signs you see as you enter our neighborhood? That's just one example.

Don't miss the chance to weigh in on such issues as traffic safety, transportation, tree canopy, parks, zoning, historical preservation, stormwater management, and more! Your response will help document our neighborhood priorities. We need participation by more than 15 percent of our households for the survey to count!

The survey is anonymous. Every household in Arlington Forest can participate, even if you rent. Nonresident homeowners may also join in. Participation is limited to one survey per household, and we ask you to give your street address so we can track participation.

## **Ball-Sellers House**

The oldest surviving building in Arlington is just across Four Mile Run from Arlington Forest in the Glencarlyn neighborhood. Built around 1742, the Arlington Historical Society has preserved John Ball's cabin and offers free tours by knowledgeable docents on Saturdays from 1 to 4 PM, April through October. It is also open Memorial, Independence, and Labor Days.

The house reopens for the season on Saturday, April 4<sup>th</sup> with a special program. Located at 5620 3rd St. South, it is a few blocks off the WO&D Trail, a pleasant walk from the Southside and lower Greenbrier sections of Arlington Forest. ## Repairs to Lubber Run Park Following Community Advocacy

The next time you're in Lubber Run Park, check out the County's recent efforts to improve accessibility and safety in response to the Lubber Run Park Committee's (LRPC) requests for action. LRPC is comprised of Arlington Foresters and residents from other Arlington neighborhoods who are active park users. The County's repairs follow a busy February for the LRPC, which conducted several walk-throughs of the park with four of the County Board's five members. In a subsequent meeting, AFCA President Esther Bowring shared concerns with Parks and Recreation Director Jane Rudolph, two of her staff and the Department of Environmental Services watershed programs manager.

During these meetings, community members asked the County to take steps to repair damage to the park caused by last July's storm and address other deterioration throughout the entire park's span. And, they have responded!

Construction of a wooden plank wall to shore up the eroded west side path is currently underway. This vital pathway provides access between the Greenbrier and Northside sections of the neighborhood and, without the downstream bridge, is the sole option into the park from the Edison playground path. In addition, crews built two rock dams in the stream to try and prevent water from overflowing the concrete spillway near the Amphitheater and fixed the nearby fire circle.

During the summer months, the County will monitor the spillway each week for blockages; and at the end of the summer, will evaluate the success of the dams in keeping water from overflowing the spillway to determine if additional measures are needed. Keeping this path clear of water is essential to providing access between sections of the neighborhood until the washed away bridges can be replaced.

In addition, as part of this spring's replacement of the deteriorated bridge near George Mason Drive, the bank erosion near the N. Columbus Street entrance will be addressed and the path enhanced.

So, what's next? The County has said it is unlikely that both of the washed away bridges will be replaced. It will be doing an engineering assessment to find the best and perhaps highest location for the one replacement bridge that is least likely to be affected in future storms.

The best way to ensure that bridge replacement is added to the County's budget is to get engaged now. Funding for Lubber Run Park's bridges is competing for limited dollars with the other bridges that were destroyed in last year's storm, as well as dozens of bridges that were identified as being in poor condition based on a recent County engineering assessment.

Funding for bridge replacement must come from the County's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) ten-year budget, which is currently being developed. The proposed budget will be announced by the County in May and approved in July. If we don't advocate now for the Lubber Run Park bridges, the funding for replacements could be many years down the road instead of in the next year or two.

What can you do? Write to the County Board (county-board@arlingtonva.us) and County Manager (countymanager@arlingtonva.us) to let them know that the community strongly urges funding of a new bridge in year one of the CIP. Plan to join your neighbors to testify at upcoming CIP meetings.

The tour committee has been hard at work over the last month, scouring all three sections of the neighborhood in search of properties to share within our community on the **2020 Home and Garden Tour** set for **Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>** from 12 to 4 p.m. This popular event gives Arlington Forest residents the chance to see firsthand the variety of construction choices that neighbors have made to personalize these vintage brick homes.

We selected homeowners who worked within the old footprint of their houses to create reimagined interior space. Others chose to build **new** additions on the side, on the back, or even both. Many have **borrowed** to finance their dreams, while others have structured their project in stages to avoid loan negotiations. A handsome **blue-gray** home arose from a semi-teardown that incorporates part of the original structure into the owners' vision for a contemporary family home. Thanks to the generous neighbors willing to participate, there will be at least fourteen homes and/or gardens on the tour.

Tickets to the Home and Garden Tour will go on sale for \$10 in late April at locations in each of the three sections

of Arlington Forest. The tour is open only to Arlington Forest residents and their guests, so proof of address will be required when purchasing tickets. While same-day tickets will be available, many people prefer to buy prior to the May  $2^{\rm nd}$  date to study the brochure and plan which homes they want to visit to inspire their own future projects.

The April *Arlington Forester* newsletter will have additional updates about the tour and provide the locations of the ticket sales. Remember, this wonderful community event only occurs every three years, so mark your calendars to take part in a spring tradition that has been going on since the 1970s.

Edison Park Project: It's final! Having secured County Board approval, Edison Park renewal construction is anticipated to start in Spring 2020 and conclude in Fall 2020. Users and neighbors will miss the usual laughter and moving children and adults in that space while the work is underway, but we'll look forward to enjoying the renovated park. Information about the park closure will be posted at the park at least one week prior to the construction start date. 
**Oak Tree Decline:** Do you have an Oak tree on your property? If so, you might be interested in attending the "Combatting Oak Tree Decline in Arlington" on Tuesday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, from 6:30 to 7:30 PM in the Arlington Central Library's auditorium. County Urban Forest Manager Vincent Verweij will explain what you can do to combat oak decline and preserve trees on your property.

**Slow Down:** The County Board in January approved a \$200 fine for speeding on Carlin Springs Road between Columbia Pike and N. George Mason Drive (through the Glencarlyn and Arlington Forest neighborhoods). The action came in response to complaints from residents about speeding and pedestrian safety. The \$200 fine is in addition to the standard fine of \$6 for every mile per hour above the speed limit plus \$66 in court fees. Enforcement will begin after the County puts up "\$200 Additional Speeding Fine" signs.

**Can I drive to a park?** We don't want you to drive. But, if you must, try to walk at least one mile from your car to the park so that you can get some exercise!



## **Barrett School News**

We are off to a great start planning for the Barrett PTA Spring Auction & Social, which will be on Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup>, at the Continental Pool Lounge in Rosslyn. In addition to attending - and bidding on wonderful items and priceless experiences - please consider contributing auction items or making a sponsorship level donation (for example, a Bronze Tiger sponsorship will be recognized on our website and in our Spring Auction & Social Catalogue). Our biennial auction is our biggest fundraising effort to support the PTA, which provides funding for many Barrett school community events.

In addition to the many activities that we sponsor such as the Ice Cream Social, Bingo Night, Staff Appreciation Week, 5th Grade promotion, and author visits - we provided Classroom Learning Environment Grants of up to \$1000 for classroom teachers for the procurement of supplies, tools, and equipment that leads to increased student engagement and learning. So far this year, teachers have been able to procure: sensory school supply and equipment for our six Special Ed classrooms; book bags for Kindergarten students to take books home for their daily reading at night; furniture as part of a flexible seating program for 2<sup>nd</sup> grade classrooms to facilitate independent work; and rugs for 4th grade classrooms for their meeting space.

Barrett PTA also provided a grant to our school library to upgrade and update the foreign language book collection, which will now have new Spanish and Arabic language books for our diverse student population. We even purchased "See Me Flags" to improve the safety of our students and families walking to and from school by helping with the visibility of pedestrians as they cross busy intersections that lack crossing guards or traffic lights. Finally, we purchased newly-designed Barrett school T-shirts for all 560 students.

In February, the school celebrated Black History Month by having an Arlingtonian guest speaker, Mr. Scott Taylor, read his story, "The Wall", about the 8 foot wall in the Hall's Hill neighborhood in Arlington that separated the black community from the rest of the neighborhood (it existed until the 1950s). He also gave information about the Black Heritage Museum of Arlington (located at 3108) Columbia Pike, Mezzanine).

Finally, a reminder that Barrett's STEAM Night is only a few days away on Thursday, March 19th. All students are invited to do a science experiment and display in the library on STEAM Night.

#### Home and Garden Tour - May 2<sup>nd</sup> (from 12-4 PM)

Foresters open up their homes to showcase newer additions, particularly cool gardens, and other things that make their homes distinctive. It is a truly unique experience to get to be able to check out the beautiful enhancements on your neighbors' home, and is one of the many traditions that makes the Forest a unique and great place to live. The tradition dates to the 1970s (and you might have seen folks looking like this strolling from home to home in those first tour years).


