

Problem: Hot/Cold Rooms due to Attic Air Leakage and Poor Airflow

- Original house bedroom were either hot or cold
- Almost no insultation in orig attic; addition has some insulation/awkward access
- The attic ducts with the 2003 addition heat pump were long, winding flex ducts, aka spaghetti






Solutions for Hot/Cold Rooms due to Attic Air

Leakage and Poor Airflow

- Attic Air Sealing and Insulation to R-49
 - Removed all fiberglass insulation
 - Added open cell foam in old attic floor
 - Added cellulose in renovated attic

- Complete Attic Duct Re-design and reroute
 - Changed from flex lines/spaghetti
 - To primary metal line down the center
 - with graduated smaller direct offshoots



^{***} Rework of addition work done in 2003 (after 20 years of inefficient heating/cooling)

Solutions for Hot/Cold Rooms due to Attic Air Leakage and Poor Airflow

Attic and ducts are now sealed and insulated with a more direct path


to heat and cool the intended upstairs rooms






Solutions for Hot/Cold Rooms due to Attic Air Leakage and Poor Airflow

- Sealed baseboards in upstairs original bedrooms
- New Attic Ladder and Insulated Tent Hatch Cover



Solutions for Unvented Roof to Lengthen Roof Lifespan and Cool Attic

- Install ridge vent on original house
- Install smart vents on original house roof






Solutions for Lower Level Air Leakage and

Pest Infiltration

- Aeroseal Original House Lower HVAC System Metal Ducts – HUGE IMPACT FELT IMMEDIATELY!
- Foam Sealed Band joints in basement
- Recessed lighting changed to canned LED recessed lights with proper dimming switches







Health and Safety Improvements

- Over-the-Gas-Range Vent venting air outside instead of just
 circulating gas fumes inside the
 kitchen
- Installed new bath fans for proper venting
 - CO Detectors on every floor
 - New Metal Dryer Vent replacing fire hazard with flex vent
