### **SUMMARY DESCRIPTION**

The subdivision of Arlington Forest is located in the western-central portion of Arlington County, approximately three and one-half miles from Washington, DC. The boundaries of the Arlington Forest Historic District extend from North Carlin Springs Road and North George Mason Drive to the north, North Henderson Road to the east, South Aberdeen Street and South Columbus Street to the south, and North Granada Street, North Galveston Street, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North to the west. Arlington Boulevard (U.S. Route 50) separates the northern and southern halves of the neighborhood and centrally-located Lubber Run Park divides the western and eastern sections. Developed in four stages between 1939 and 1948, the architecture of Arlington Forest is defined by orderly rows of brick, detached, two-story, single-family homes featuring six rooms and minimal Colonial Revival decorative detailing. While there are great similarities amongst the houses in Arlington Forest, the housing stock is differentiated by variations in roof shape, porch and entrance location, use of brick and clapboard materials, and arrangement of fenestration. The Historic District also contains a period neighborhood shopping center and three public parks. Arlington Forest is one of the best examples of a mid-20th century planned, mixeduse community in Arlington County. The neighborhood typifies the innovative trends of World War II-era suburban planning, as advocated by the Federal Housing Administration in its house designs and subdivision guidelines, and incorporates curvilinear streets and cul-de-sacs, community parklands, and a neighborhood shopping center into its original design. There are 724 contributing primary resources and 92 non-contributing primary resources in the Arlington Forest Historic District. The Historic District also contains 89 contributing secondary resources and 201 non-contributing secondary resources.

### **DETAILED DESCRIPTION**

### Setting

Prior to the platting of Arlington Forest, this area typified the rural character of Arlington County and contained only fields and woodland. A 1934 aerial photograph of this portion of the County reveals that the Arlington Forest area prior to development was wooded, except for the open fields of a farm on North Galveston Street (now in the 200 block) and the historic Henderson estate (formerly located at 4811 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North). Arlington Forest derives its name from this wooded setting, now evident in the tree-lined curvilinear streets and cul-de-sacs that follow the sloping terrain, as well as in the parklands running through the middle of the neighborhood. Ironically, the developers of Arlington Forest destroyed much of the earlier wooded scenery during the construction phase, which resulted in a barren appearance not in keeping with the lush surroundings implied by the neighborhood's name. Over time, the remaining trees have matured and new trees have been planted, once again creating a natural canopy reminiscent of the original setting of the area.

There are three houses dating to the 19<sup>th</sup> century located in the Arlington Forest neighborhood. Outside the western edge of the district at 5512 North Carlin Springs Road is the Mary Carlin House, constructed circa 1800 by William Carlin, the tailor of George Washington. This one-story log home originally was part of his 165-acre tract purchased in 1772. Carlin later gave the property to his granddaughters, Mary and Ann Carlin. Mary Carlin was born in the house circa 1805 and resided there until her death in 1905. Broyhill's Addition within the Arlington Forest Historic District contains the other two 19<sup>th</sup> century homes. The one-story Ann Carlin cottage, located at 117 North Galveston Street, dates to around 1850 and was built as a tenant house or servants' quarters. Lastly, the two-story, frame farmhouse at 205 North Galveston Street likely dates from the 1820s to 1840s. During the Civil War, this property was owned by Charles E. Mix, Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Today, only the dwelling and a carriage house remain.

## **Development of Arlington Forest, 1939-1948**

Planned and built by Meadowbrook Construction Company, an active building and real estate development firm in the metropolitan Washington, DC, area in the early- to mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, Arlington Forest contains modest-sized, two-story, brick, detached single-family dwellings. Although at first glance the six-room houses appear to be identical, local architect Robert O. Scholz designed subtle variations in roof shapes, locations of entrances and porches, and the use and placement of materials that differentiate the homes and define the architectural character of the neighborhood. Meadowbrook's President Monroe Warren, in collaboration with Scholz, relied upon the popular national trends in subdivision planning and design as their inspiration, in particular the subdivision planning tactics and architectural designs promoted by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). The architectural variety characteristic of Arlington Forest was in keeping with the FHA design standards, which emphasized a harmonious collection of homes without monotony or excessive architectural ornamentation.<sup>1</sup>

By the time the Arlington Forest subdivision was underway, Meadowbrook's business address was listed as 431 Tower Building, Washington, DC.<sup>2</sup> The Meadowbrook office later moved to Chevy Chase, Maryland, and was located at 3707 East West Highway.<sup>3</sup> For his Arlington Forest venture, Warren collaborated with Scholz, who previously was a partner in the firm of Baer & Scholz where he designed several apartment buildings in Washington, DC, including the high-style Alban Towers on Massachusetts Avenue, NW, in 1928-1929.<sup>4</sup> He established his own firm, Robert O. Scholz Company, Inc., in 1934 and continued an active role up until his death in 1978.<sup>5</sup> His office was located at 1625 K Street, NW (Washington, DC), and later relocated down the block to 1614 following World War II.<sup>6</sup> Scholz is regarded as one of the seven major architects of residential and commercial Art Deco style buildings in the Nation's Capital.<sup>7</sup> Scholz designed several variations of the same basic floor plan for the Colonial Revival homes in Arlington County's Arlington Forest subdivision.

Meadowbrook first broke ground for Arlington Forest in 1939 (see Figure 1 for the development progression of the entire neighborhood from 1939 to 1948). The first phase to be completed, appropriately known as Southside, was along and south of Lee Boulevard (now called Arlington

Boulevard or U.S. Route 50). The very first building permits for the entire Arlington Forest subdivision were issued July 13, 1939 for a portion of the Southside section. The permits were for those houses along the eastern side of South Park Drive from numbers 11 through 47. Building permits for 4750, 4754, and 4758 Arlington Boulevard also were issued on this same date. One day later on July 14, 1939, building permits were approved for 4762 and 4766 Arlington Boulevard. Construction along South Aberdeen Street was underway by Fall 1939. By the end of April 1940, Meadowbrook boasted it already had sold 130 homes in Arlington Forest and was averaging the sale of one house per day. Construction in Southside continued through the summer of 1940, expanding westward along Arlington Boulevard and including South Buchanan, South Columbus, and South 1st streets. Meadowbrook featured the home at 4766 Arlington Boulevard as a furnished exhibit home.

The second phase of development also occurred in 1940 as Meadowbrook crossed Arlington Boulevard (the north/south dividing line in the County) into the northern sector of the County east of Lubber Run Park. Extending from Arlington Boulevard northward to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North and between North Columbus Street and North Henderson Road, this portion of Arlington Forest is known as Northside. This section was built on land historically associated with the Henderson family's estate. The first building permits for the Northside section were approved on June 6, 1940 for the homes at 4754, 4758, 4762, and 4766 1<sup>st</sup> Street North. By October 1940, Meadowbrook claimed it had sold more than 230 Arlington Forest homes in just ten months, a clear indication of "proof of value." Building permits for Northside, including the Arlington Forest Shopping Center fronting both Arlington Forest Park and Arlington Boulevard, continued to be issued through December 11, 1941. Another furnished exhibit home was located in Northside at 4767 Arlington Boulevard.

The third phase of the subdivision, known as Greenbrier, is that portion of Arlington Forest located west of Lubber Run Park. Greenbrier evolved in nine distinct and continuous phases between 1941 and 1946. The first building permits for the Greenbrier section were issued on May 23, 1941 for those homes on the cul-de-sac of 1<sup>st</sup> Street North; numbers 5207 and 5301 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North; numbers 1 and 5 North Granada Street; and numbers 9 through 114 North

Greenbrier Street. A considerable portion of Greenbrier was approved for construction during and after World War II, including:

- 335 through 390 North Granada Street, 5106 through 5228 North Carlin Springs Road, and 382, 390, 394, and 398 North Edison Street (December 1941);
- 206 through 377 and 383, 389, 395, and 399 North Edison Street, and 5160 and 5161 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North (April 1942);
- North Evergreen Street (October 1945); and
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North (October 1945 and also March 1946).

A final phase of construction in Arlington Forest occurred in 1948. Adjacent to the western edge of Greenbrier, this phase was not part of the original subdivision as planned and built by Meadowbrook. Known as Broyhill's Addition, this last section is attributed to another locally prominent builder and architect team. M.T. Broyhill & Sons achieved success as one of the largest builders of brick homes throughout the metropolitan Washington, DC, area, active particularly in the mid-1940s through the 1950s. Architect J. Raymond Mims, whose career spanned more than 40 years, relocated to Arlington by 1940 and designed a range of residential, institutional, and commercial projects, including his 1948 Streamline Moderne-styled Al's Motor's Building at 3910 Wilson Boulevard in the Ballston neighborhood of Arlington County. 12 By the time they began their project in Arlington Forest, Broyhill & Sons' office was located at 4601 Lee Highway in Arlington and Mims' business address was listed simply as Arlington. 13 Although similar to and compatible with the established Arlington Forest neighborhood, Broyhill and Mims created a slightly modified and larger variation of Meadowbrook's basic house plan.<sup>14</sup> The homes within Broyhill's Addition are located along North Carlin Springs Road, the western half of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North, and along North Galveston Street. The first building permits for Broyhill's Addition were issued on March 23, 1948 for 5332 through 5420 North Carlin Springs Road, the 200 and 300 blocks of North Galveston Street, and 5325, 5329, and 5353 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North. Construction for the remainder of Broyhill's Addition was approved just two months later in May 1948. Broyhill's Addition is included within the Arlington Forest Historic District since it is contained within the boundaries of the neighborhood citizen's association and because

its Colonial Revival-styled architecture complements the Meadowbrook predecessors and also is based upon the subdivision planning requirements established by the FHA.

### The Architecture of Arlington Forest

In its 1936 bulletin entitled *Principles of Planning Small Houses*, FHA's Small House Program presented five sample house designs with gabled roofs to be used in new planned subdivisions or as infill in existing neighborhoods. Labeled types A through E, they offered a range of living comfort and space in both one- and two-story models. Each of the different types was depicted with only the simplest, basic, and most cost-effective features illustrated. They could be built in a range of materials, from frame, brick, or concrete block, to shingles, reinforced concrete, stucco, or stone. House Types A and B were one-story models with a living room, kitchen, bathroom, and two bedrooms. Type A, also known as the "FHA minimum house," measured only 534 square feet. House Types C and D were considerably larger, with two full stories and two bedrooms on the upper floor. Type D, with the main entrance located on the front elevation, also featured an attached garage large enough for one automobile. House Type E was the largest FHA design, with an optional basement, three bedrooms on the second level, and simple Classically-inspired ornamentation around the front entrance and in the gable end.

In 1940, the FHA revised its *Principles of Planning Small Houses*, shifting the focus of house design and construction to creating a flexible system of interior and exterior space based not just on livability, but also variability and expandability. This new approach considered such factors as sunlight and wind on the orientation of a house; the ability to enlarge interior spaces by extending particular rooms and creating an irregular floor plan; adding basements, fireplaces, and chimneys as standard building features; and standardizing construction materials (from the plumbing and joists to the windows, cabinets, and hardware). Consequently, variations of the same basic house designs could be created simply by reversing floor plans, using different exterior materials, or selecting different entrances or roof types.

The symmetrical, square-shaped house plans of Arlington Forest are derived from three of the 1936 FHA designs described above, yet also illustrate the standardization and variation of

construction and materials advocated in the 1940 publication. Most prominent in Arlington Forest is House Type E, 17 with the entrance located on the side elevation. Meadowbrook adapted this FHA model in several ways for use in Arlington Forest. Warren and Scholz included the full basement option, the standard three bedrooms on the second floor, the Colonial Revival decoration around the main entrance door, and often an attached one-story side porch shielding the entry door. Meadowbrook also chose to orient House Type E in Arlington Forest with the windowed facade facing the street and the main entrance on either the left or right side elevation. Missing from any of the Arlington Forest designs, however, is the semi-circular window in the side gable end featured in the FHA design. Arlington Forest also contains variations of House Type D, modified to include a basement, three upper bedrooms, often a side porch on either the left or right elevation, and without the attached garage shown in the FHA illustration. Lastly, there are a few examples of House Type C in Arlington Forest (e.g., 100 and 104 North Greenbrier Street), modified to include the standard basement and three bedrooms, and an entrance on the front elevation sheltered by a projecting, one-story shed-roofed porch. The FHA also depicted House Type C with two contrasting building materials defining the lower and upper floors, a theme adopted by Meadowbrook throughout its Arlington Forest development. According to plot plan renderings of the subdivision, Scholz also created a schedule of different exterior brick colors and finishes, which also contributed to a sense of variety in the neighborhood.

There are four different roof types used in the community. The side gable form is the predominant roof type, found in 85 percent of the houses in the district. The other three roof types include hipped, gambrel, and pyramidal. With the exception of two roofs clad in standing seam metal (117 North Galveston Street and 398 North Edison Street), the roofs of all the dwellings are clad in asphalt shingles. According to a detailed plat drawn by Scholz, the roofs originally were clad in a range of varying color schemes, including blends of red, green, or purple, as well as blue/black.<sup>18</sup>

The most distinctive element of the architectural design is the location of the main entrance. To maintain variety and interest throughout a neighborhood, the FHA design standards suggested alternating the end and side elevations toward the street. <sup>19</sup> Meadowbrook incorporated several

such variations, ranging from an entrance on the front facade, to those located on either the left-or right-side elevation without any discernable rhythm or pattern. Of equal interest is the type and placement of the main entrance porch. Typically, those homes with entrances on the front facade have either a simple projecting porch around the entrance or no porch at all. Most homes with front entrances feature a small side porch on either the left- or right-side elevation. There is a range of side entrance porch types, including open, screened, and enclosed. Available documentation suggests that the open side porch type was the original design used by Meadowbrook, with screens and enclosures appearing over the years as owners' needs and preferences warranted. The shapes of porch roofs are equally varied, and include shed, hipped, gabled, and pyramidal.

The predominant building material is brick. There is a total of 682 Arlington Forest homes of all brick construction. All homes feature stretcher bond and rowlock window sills. Scholz selected brick shades ranging from light red and dark red to brick painted white. Four different house types with hipped, gambrel, and pyramidal roofs are scattered throughout the subdivision and feature a combination of all brick construction or brick on the first level and wood siding on the second level. There are 64 of the hipped models, 45 of the gambrel models, and only 10 of the pyramidal models. There is no discernable pattern to how Meadowbrook and Scholz selected particular house types or color palettes per block.

Overall decorative ornament is minimal, expressed by the symmetry of the two-bay wide front facades and the simple Colonial Revival-influenced trim and detailing. Many Arlington Forest homes still feature their original wood entrance door, detailed with eight square lights at the top and two vertical panels below that extend the length of the door. Colonial Revival wood door surrounds with either plain or fluted pilasters are typical for those entrances on the front elevation. Many of the door surrounds are topped with a decorative pediment, ranging from triangular and segmental to broken pediments with a central finial. With the exception of only 58 homes, all are adorned with decorative window shutters on their front elevation. The different styles of shutters include louvered, paneled, and board and batten. Only four of the houses have decorative fascia boards lined with dentils on their front elevation. In his plot plan renderings, Scholz also indicated that blinds were available in a range of colors, including willow green,

forest green, cherry red, and cottage brown.<sup>21</sup> However, it is unclear if these blinds were actually interior window treatments as opposed to exterior window shutters. Given the available colors and the prominence of decorative shutters throughout the neighborhood, it is possible that Scholz was describing exterior window shutters. Trim for the windows and exterior was originally either cream or white.<sup>22</sup>

From early photographs of the community and promotional materials published by Meadowbrook, the first phase of Arlington Forest homes originally were outfitted with metal casement windows on both the first and second levels. Shortages of building materials during World War II necessitated the use of wooden double-hung sash windows in many of the homes constructed in Greenbrier and Northside. Additionally, many property owners over time have replaced the original casements or double-hung sash with a variety of window types. Of these replacements, double-hung sash windows in both wood and vinyl are the most common. Other types of replacement windows include modern casements, awning sash, fixed picture windows, and projecting bay and greenhouse-type windows. Of the earlier homes in the subdivision, 143 still contain all or some of their original casement windows.

The architecture of Arlington Forest also had a modern manner about them in that the interiors were arranged economically to reduce unnecessary floor space and the amount of wiring and plumbing needed to outfit each house. Official promotional brochures published by Meadowbrook described in detail the interior specifications of its Arlington Forest homes. Two different editions of the brochure described Arlington Forest as a "restricted community" of detached six-room homes on large wooded lots. Neighborhood amenities, which were installed and paid for by Meadowbrook, included sewers, water, electricity, gas, and paved streets with concrete curbs, gutters, and sidewalks. Building lots were sodded from the curb to the rear of the houses and artistically landscaped. Meadowbrook boasted its use of the best available construction materials, as well as assured potential buyers that its labor force was highly skilled and constantly supervised. The company even claimed its homes offered customers "more for [their] money than can be had anywhere in the vicinity of Washington." Scholz relied on the "Old Dominion" architecture for his inspiration for the Colonial design of the Arlington Forest homes. Standard building specifications for each home included:

- a full unfinished basement constructed of solid concrete and intended for use as a future recreational room;
- air-conditioned heat provided by an oil burner;
- an automatic gas hot water storage heater;
- two coats of plaster on a rock lath plaster base;
- metal corner beads at exposed corners and metal lath in all angled corners;
- triple sealed Celotex insulation throughout the house;
- steel casement windows with metal trim and 16 mesh copper screens on first and second floors;
- double flooring on both first and second levels finished with 7/8-inch select white oak;
- copper water pipes;
- a basement floor drain;
- hose connections in front and rear; and
- a built-in radio antenna.

The kitchen featured easy to clean painted walls and ceiling, as well as an inlaid linoleum floor cemented over felt. A gas range with an insulated oven and heat control was standard, as were custom-built, factory-finished metal kitchen cabinets. The kitchen also included a one-piece sink with a double drain board, strainer-stopper, and chrome-plated swing nozzle faucet. The bathroom was decorated with black and white tiled walls with a matching tile floor. Five built-in bathroom fixtures were standard, including a toilet, sink, and tub with shower. All fittings were chromium-plated and the steel medicine cabinet featured a Venetian mirror door. All windows and doors were trimmed with shades on the interior and Colonial-styled hardware was found throughout the house.

The homes in the Southside section were advertised for the price of \$5,990. Buyers needed only a cash down payment of \$590, which included all settlement costs. Loans from the FHA were available at 4½ percent interest for a payback period of either 20 or 25 years. On the 20-year financing plan, monthly payments, including principal, interest, and estimated taxes and insurance, totaled \$42.94. Monthly payments on the 25-year plan were just \$38.82.

The second edition of Meadowbrook's promotional brochure for Arlington Forest, likely dating to the construction phase of Greenbrier and Northside in 1940-1941, had slightly modified payment arrangements.<sup>27</sup> Although the standard house model was still available for the same price of \$5,990, the cash down payment required totaled \$750, which included \$590 plus \$160 in settlement fees. Total monthly payments were just several cents more, listed as \$43.10 on the 20-year financing plan and \$38.98 on the 25-year plan. Houses situated on corner lots were an extra \$500.28 The only other difference in the building specifications provided in the second brochure was the indication that the bathroom contained six built-in fixtures rather than five. In the spring of 1941, potential customer Hazel Walker saw the home at 231 North Park Drive under construction. She informed Meadowbrook that even though she liked the house, she preferred to have a fireplace and a front entrance as opposed to a side entrance. She agreed to purchase the home when she was told these modifications would cost only an additional \$500.<sup>29</sup> Such alterations and extras were quite common. According to a copy of an original "Statement of Sale and Loan" from Meadowbrook, Inc., to Harold D. Hoekstra dated 18 August 1941, Meadowbrook offered specific extras to its buyers. For the cost of \$9.00, Hoekstra had Meadowbrook install a rear stoop light. The installation of wallpaper cost an additional \$9.05. The total cost of Hoekstra's new home, located at 253 North Columbus Street, was \$6,690.62.30 Numerous other options were available for \$500 each, including a screened porch<sup>31</sup> or a detached garage.<sup>32</sup> In addition to any interior wallpaper, the buyers were at liberty to select the style of the window shutters and paint trim color.<sup>33</sup>

Shortages in building materials due to the onset of World War II resulted in modifications to houses being built in the central part of the Greenbrier section.<sup>34</sup> These homes had a slightly smaller floor plan of 1,050 square feet versus the standard house size of 1,144 square feet. Galvanized pipes were substituted for the standard copper pipes, and wooden double-hung sash windows replaced the metal casement windows. Some houses built during World War II featured a coal furnace rather than an oil-burning furnace, including 5160 and 5161 3<sup>rd</sup> Street North and 206 through 389, 395, and 399 North Edison Street.<sup>35</sup>

To determine the sequence of the various phases of development within the subdivision, as well as to confirm construction dates for each of the primary and secondary contributing buildings in

the Historic District, extensive research was conducted in the County's microfilm collection of historic building permit records. All but four of the original permit records for the dwellings were found. According to the permit documents, County zoning requirements stated that the owner or builder had to begin construction within 60 days of the approval date indicated on the building permit and complete the project within a reasonable amount of time. It can be assumed that construction began immediately thereafter in order to begin subsequent sections of this sizable residential project and maintain a continuous construction schedule.

For the purposes of this National Register nomination, the various house types within Arlington Forest were classified into ten different categories according to front entrance location, roof shape, and building materials. In summary, House Types 1 through 6 represent Meadowbrook's homes in the original sections of Arlington Forest. House Type 7 specifically refers to those homes within Broyhill's Addition. House Types 8, 9, 10 are additional variations used by Meadowbrook in only a few homes scattered throughout the original subdivision. A description of each of these categories is as follows, with semblances to the FHA house types indicated in parentheses as applicable:

- House Type 1: Front entrance, side gable roof, all brick construction, with or without siding in the gable ends (FHA Types C and D)
- House Type 2: Side entrance, side gable roof, all brick construction, with or without siding in the gable ends (FHA Type E)
- House Type 3: Front entrance, hipped roof, brick first floor with wood sided second floor
- House Type 4: Side entrance, hipped roof, brick first floor with wood sided second floor
- House Type 5: Front entrance, gambrel roof, brick first floor with wood sided second floor
- House Type 6: Side entrance, gambrel roof, brick first floor with wood sided second floor
- House Type 7: Central front entrance, side gable roof, all brick construction
- House Type 8: Front or side entrance, pyramidal roof, all brick construction

- House Type 9: Front or side entrance, side gable roof, brick first floor with wood sided second floor
- House Type 10: Side entrance, hipped roof, all brick construction.

Since the latter decades of the 20th century, many Arlington Forest homes have undergone minor renovations and upgrades to better accommodate the changing spatial needs and tastes of modern families. Such alterations range from enclosing existing porches, building new entrance porches, constructing rear or side additions, or installing replacement windows. In a community of this size, with only modest-sized dwellings, such alterations over time are inevitable. However, despite the alterations and minor additions that have occurred in Arlington Forest since its construction, the majority of features detailing the homes' original form and style (e.g., massing, spatial relationships, proportions, patterns of windows and doors, use of materials, and ornamentation) remain considerably intact. When evaluating the contributing/non-contributing status of those houses that have undergone modifications, it was determined that minor and compatible additions, porch enclosures, or the replacement of original metal casement or wood double-hung sash windows with vinyl or other modern replacements did not mask or detract from the appearance of the buildings' original design, massing, or proportions. Only a handful of dwellings in Arlington Forest were so altered that their original form, significant features, or detailing were either completely lost or obscured; these nine houses were considered to be noncontributing primary resources in the Historic District. Another home built in 1976 in the southeastern corner of the District also was considered a non-contributing primary resource.

### The Architecture of Broyhill's Addition

Although still two stories in height and of brick construction with Colonial Revival detailing, the homes comprising the post-World War II Broyhill's Addition are slightly different than the standard Arlington Forest model constructed by Meadowbrook prior to and during the War. The Broyhill homes feature Colonial Revival-styled entrances centered on the front elevation, double-hung sash windows, slightly larger room sizes, and a living room fireplace. At the time of their completion in 1948, the Broyhill models cost \$10,000, which was almost double the original Meadowbrook price of nearly \$6,000. The Broyhill homes also feature the largest floor plans

in the neighborhood with 1,196 square feet of living space.<sup>37</sup> Despite the larger living area, the County's historic building permit records revealed that the Broyhill homes contained five rooms as opposed to Meadowbrook's standard six.

M.T. Broyhill & Sons was one of the largest local builders in the metropolitan Washington, DC, area. Developer Marvin T. Broyhill first went into business with his brother, Lincoln R. Broyhill, who worked as a carpenter. Born in Wilkes County, North Carolina, Marvin attended business school in Cincinnati, Ohio, and Omaha Technical School in Nebraska. In 1912, he was employed by the Southern Railroad Company as a shipping clerk and telegraph operator. In 1915, he established the Virginia Real Estate Association, eventually moving to Arlington County in 1937 where he built houses in a subdivision of the Ashton Heights neighborhood. Between 1946 and 1955, Broyhill & Sons built more than 8,000 brick houses in Northern Virginia alone, including those within their section of Arlington Forest. Interestingly, these likely were some of the very first homes built by Broyhill & Sons, reputed to be the largest builder of brick homes in the entire United States according to the Structural Clay Products Institute. Research conducted to date also suggests that Broyhill's Addition to Arlington Forest is the first large-scale single-family residential project in Arlington County that was designed by architect J. Raymond Mims (see Section 7, page 5).

### Garages and Outbuildings in Arlington Forest

Each house lot contains a driveway along one side of the property for parking personal automobiles. As the popularity of the automobile steadily increased, many of the homes within Arlington Forest began to feature freestanding garages and/or sheds. The garage structures are typically of brick or frame construction, with a sampling constructed of concrete block. To date, only one County building permit has been found for any accessory buildings or garages built by Meadowbrook as part of the original subdivision. In January 1941, about four months after the building permit for the house had been approved, Meadowbrook built a one-story brick and concrete block garage with an estimated value of \$285 for F.J. Merkling of 4851 Arlington Boulevard. The County's historic building permit records were consulted to verify the

construction dates of garages and sheds and determine their contributing or non-contributing status in the Historic District.

In addition to garages, there is a large number of sheds within the Historic District. Typically only one-story in height and constructed of wood or pre-fabricated metal, these sheds are categorized as any storage or unidentified structures. The sheds generally are not stick-built or of substantial permanent construction. Although many properties have sheds, few are actually considered to be historic. Other types of outbuildings and accessory structures to be noted include carports and greenhouses.

### The Arlington Forest Shopping Center

The FHA also promoted the use of the neighborhood shopping center as part of successful community planning. Although the concept of having stores and commercial services as part of planned suburbs dates to the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century, it was not until the early- to mid-20<sup>th</sup> century that the location and design of these buildings were considered to contribute to a community's quality of life and retention of real estate values. Their construction often occurred simultaneously with a residential development, mirroring a similar architectural style and scale in keeping with the surrounding residential character. One of the earliest prototypes of suburban shopping facilities was the Park and Shop model, created by architect Arthur Heaton in 1930 and built for the real estate firm of Shannon and Luchs in the Cleveland Park section of Washington, DC. Inspired by the drive-in markets popular in California, the Park and Shop was built and managed by a single owner and offered assorted household services such as a grocery, deli, and cleaners. Heaton's model contained a row of shops arranged in an L-shaped configuration that formed two sides of a parking court bordering the street. A gasoline station typically anchored one side of the complex. By February 1934, Heaton's example was highlighted in *Architectural Record* as a model for neighborhood planning.

In addition to house designs, the 1936 FHA publication *Planning Neighborhoods for Small Houses* also included illustrations of small neighborhood shopping centers that could be built separate from, but adjacent to, new residential subdivisions or multi-family rental

developments.<sup>46</sup> To be a true asset to the neighborhood, the FHA recommended the shopping centers be located on the main roadways at prominent intersections, as well as feature architectural control, adequate off-street parking for its customers, service alleys, and a large area from which to draw its patrons. Throughout the metropolitan Washington, DC, area, shopping centers satisfying these requirements were built in several FHA-approved communities, including Colonial Village, Buckingham Village, and later Arlington Forest in 1941, all in Arlington County, Virginia.

The Arlington Forest Shopping Center is modeled after the Spring Valley/Wesley Heights Shopping Center, built in Bethesda, Maryland, by Shannon and Luchs circa 1935.<sup>47</sup> This Bethesda facility was featured in the FHA's *Planning Profitable Neighborhoods* in 1938, 48 undoubtedly serving as inspiration for Meadowbrook's adaptation in Arlington Forest just three years later. According to Arlington County building permit number 12876, Meadowbrook, Inc., received approval to construct a brick shopping center fronting Arlington Boulevard (U.S. Route 50) at 4801-4819 1st Street North on April 28, 1941. Designed by architect Robert O. Scholz, the one-story building originally had an estimated value of \$60,000. It was built to provide a mixture of convenience goods and services to the adjacent Arlington Forest subdivision, especially luring homeward-bound automobile commuters traveling from Washington, DC.

The Arlington Forest Shopping Center consists of three different sections built in 1941, 1946, and 1947. The original 1941 section included those businesses between the addresses of 4801 and 4819 1<sup>st</sup> Street North on the eastern portion of the site. An A & P Supermarket was the anchor store on the east end and a People's Drug Store anchored the west end (#4819). The first business to open was the Forest Delicatessen, operated by Jack and Pauline Cohen.<sup>51</sup> Other early businesses included a hardware and appliance store, a dry cleaners, a shoe repair shop, and a beauty salon.<sup>52</sup> The construction of an adjacent wing to the west containing stores numbered 4821 through 4825 1<sup>st</sup> Street North was approved August 29, 1946, and built by J.B. Spund & Max Biron.<sup>53</sup> Early occupants of this wing included Dorothy's Women and Children's Wear, The Forest Grill restaurant, the Forest Pastry Shop, and later a realty company. The third section located at 4831 1<sup>st</sup> Street North at the far western end of the complex, which originally contained an Esso service station, was approved for construction July 11, 1947.<sup>54</sup> The Arlington Forest

Shopping Center has remained in continuous use since first opening in 1941, and it continues to serve the surrounding community. Today it contains eleven businesses.<sup>55</sup>

In keeping with the design and neighborhood planning standards of the era, especially those advocated by the FHA, the Arlington Forest Shopping Center is situated prominently at the edge of the subdivision along commuter route Arlington Boulevard. It reflects the simplicity and Colonial Revival styling of the surrounding residential neighborhood through such details as its: brick construction with brick rowlock window sills and dentiled brick cornice; plain decorative columns supporting a continuous roof overhang that shields the storefronts; a frame balustrade with plain wood posts and slats topping the roof line of the overhang along the original section of the building; a brick end wall chimney at each end of the original rectangular main block; and a centered, frame cupola with arched openings and a domed copper top with a finial, located on the central ridge of the main side gable roof. The shopping center has an L-shaped configuration, formed by the projecting anchor store on the east end and the rectangular block of the remaining portion of the complex. On the original rectangular block, each store features a single entrance with a glazed paneled door with functional four-light transom, and a large three-pane plate glass show window with functional four-light transoms above each pane. The exception is the entrance to #4805, which has synthetic siding applied to the entrance area and two glass panel doors flanked by tripartite windows. Simple molded wood trim adorns the door and window openings of the main block, with more elaborate trim with pilasters surrounding the entrance to #4819. Several store entrances also are adorned with single-light iron carriage lamps.

The 1946 addition contains single and paired fixed replacement windows, a projecting flat-roofed porch supported by plain columns identical to those along the rest of the complex, and a similar roofline balustrade. This wing now has synthetic siding affixed to the original brick in the entrance area and has an applied stucco finish from the window level upwards. The 1947 addition appears to maintain the same fenestration as the original main block, with single entry doors with large shop windows divided into three sections. It appears these windows in the westernmost wing are replacements. This wing also features a simple two-band brick cornice.

Customer parking is available in a paved off-street lot fronting the entire complex, as well as along a service road paralleling Arlington Boulevard. Lining the parking area is a total of eleven Carlyle-style street lamps, which feature molded bases, fluted metal shafts, and rounded glass bulbs. Most likely not original to the complex, they are in keeping with its Colonial Revival character. A simple freestanding metal box sign on a brick base, located outside #4821 and facing the service road, advertises the shopping center.

An undated early photograph of the complex, most likely from the early-1940s, reveals that the cupola is original, but the roofline balustrade originally lined only the rectangular main block of the building. The balustrade, which originally featured three panels of Chippendale-styled cross bracing between each squared post, did not extend to the central portion of the block; instead a neon "Arlington Forest Shopping Centre" sign adorned the building in this central section. Each store had a similarly-designed neon sign affixed to the fascia of the overhang lining the store fronts. The namesake sign has been removed, replaced by a new and continuous balustrade. The original neon store signs also have been replaced with modern-day metal boxed sign panels with block lettering. Thin wood columns have been replaced with newer columns on squared concrete bases. Both the A & P Supermarket and the People's Drugstore historically had awning overhangs projecting from their fronts. Today, the store front of the 1947 wing is adorned by a modern fabric awning.

The Arlington Forest Shopping Center retains substantial integrity of its overall design and configuration, massing, setting, materials, and its important association with its crossroads location and surrounding residential neighborhood. Currently owned by the Arlington Forest Association, the Shopping Center has continued its historic association with the residents of Arlington Forest and still maintains its feel as a neighborhood Park and Shop enterprise as originally intended by Meadowbrook and Scholz. The complex has undergone only minimal exterior alterations, limited to detailing treatments as described above, the addition of a portico off the far eastern wall (which provides access to a basement level retail store), and the closure of the historic service station. Some of the synthetic materials that have been applied to specific storefronts over time, including siding and stucco, could be removed to reveal the original brick construction underneath. Despite these modifications over time, the Arlington Forest Shopping

Center continues to convey its significance as a planned Park and Shop type commercial shopping center in the Colonial Revival style.

### **Public Structures and Parks in Arlington Forest**

In addition to the shopping center, there are several other examples of civic, religious, and recreational facilities in and near the Arlington Forest Historic District, including a recreational center, a swimming pool and pool house, an elementary school, two churches, and three public parks. The Lubber Run Community Center stands at 300 North Park Drive at the northern edge of the Arlington Forest Historic District on the site of the historic Henderson estate. Arlington County bought the late-19<sup>th</sup> century Henderson family house in 1951 and converted it for use as the County's first recreational center. The historic house was destroyed by fire during Hurricane Hazel on October 16, 1954, and was too badly damaged to be rebuilt.<sup>56</sup> According to Arlington County building permit records, a new recreational center was built on the same site in 1956 by L.R. Broyhill Company.<sup>57</sup> Today, the two-story brick facility continues to host Countysponsored recreational and educational programs, as well as meetings of the Arlington Forest Citizen's Association. The Lubber Run Community Center is not included as a contributing building within the Arlington Forest Historic District since it was not part of the original planning for and construction of the subdivision. Yet, the building retains integrity of its original setting, design, and materials, and continues to serve its original function as a community recreational facility.

Another community facility is situated outside the western edge of the Arlington Forest Historic District at the intersection of North Jefferson Street and North Carlin Springs Road. According to Arlington County building permit records, Paddock Engineering Company received approval to construct a community swimming pool for the Arlington Forest Club, Inc., on February 2, 1955. Three months later on May 5, 1955, construction plans for a neighboring bath house at 5401 North Carlin Springs Road were approved. Builder Earl K. Rosti erected the building for the Arlington Forest Club, Inc. By 1959, a tennis court also existed on the pool grounds. The swimming pool, bath house, and tennis court have remained in continuous use, and membership is now available to both Arlington Forest and other County residents. Even though still owned

and operated by the Arlington Forest Club, Inc., the community pool complex is not included within the boundaries of the Historic District since it was not part of the original subdivision of Arlington Forest and is not of exceptional architecture or engineering style. Interestingly, the Arlington Forest Recreation Club as an organization dates to March 15, 1945, when it first used quarters located in the rear space of the barber shop in the Arlington Forest Shopping Center. Sponsored by the Arlington Forest Citizens Association, the Club was open to all adult and teenaged residents of Arlington Forest, regardless if they were official members of the Association. Original activities available included table tennis, dancing, card games, and other suitable games and hobbies.

Kate Waller Barrett Elementary School, located at 4401 North Henderson Road in the far northeastern corner of the Arlington Forest neighborhood, was constructed in 1939 prior to the development of the Arlington Forest subdivision. The Colonial Revival-styled brick building was designed by the Office of the State Architect, Division of School Buildings in Richmond. Barrett School was built to serve the neighboring garden apartment community of Buckingham Village and sits on land purchased with the financial aid of its developer Allie Freed. The subsequent completion of the Arlington Forest neighborhood by the mid-1940s resulted in overcrowding at the school. This influx of additional school-aged children from Arlington Forest was a major factor in the construction of two additions in 1946 and 1950. Since the Barrett School predates the development and was not part of the original subdivision of Arlington Forest, it is excluded from the boundaries of the Arlington Forest Historic District.

There are two churches within the Arlington Forest neighborhood. Arlington Forest Methodist Church is located at 4701 Arlington Boulevard at the intersection with North Henderson Road. Originally built in 1943, substantial additions were completed in 1953 and 1960. On the adjacent lot to the north is the Arlington Assembly of God at 4501 North Pershing Drive. Neither of the churches is included in the Historic District boundaries because they were not part of the original subdivision and are not architecturally distinct.

Three public parks are contributing elements to the Arlington Forest Historic District and are integral to the topography and scenic landscape of the area. Lubber Run Park, which bisects the

northern half of the Historic District, was the first public park created in Arlington County. At the June 29, 1940, meeting of the Arlington County Board, Meadowbrook President Monroe Warren announced he would dedicate to the County a 5.1-acre parcel along Lee [Arlington] Boulevard one mile west of Glebe Road. This donation from the developer of Arlington Forest increased the total size of Lubber Run Park to twenty acres. In the center of Lubber Run Park is a wood and concrete block structure known as the Lubber Run Amphitheater that continues to provide an ideal setting for outdoor concerts and performances. Since the amphitheater does not correlate to Arlington Forest's period of significance, it is considered a non-contributing structure in the Historic District.

There are two additional parks in the Arlington Forest Historic District. The one-acre Arlington Forest Park fronting Arlington Boulevard at its intersection with 1<sup>st</sup> Road North and 1<sup>st</sup> Street North most likely was dedicated by Meadowbrook during construction of the Northside section and the Arlington Forest Shopping Center. Edison Park at 213 North Edison Street in the Greenbrier section offers a community playground and picnic area for residents on one-quarter of an acre of land. Immediately outside the southwestern boundary of the Arlington Forest Historic District is Glencarlyn Park. In 1940, the trustees of the neighboring Glencarlyn community deeded 95 acres of parkland to the County. This open space included parts of Glencarlyn, Long Branch, and Lubber Run parks.

### **Development After 1948**

Several additional small enclaves of homes dating from 1950 to 1968 border the original subdivision of Arlington Forest and Broyhill's Addition. These more contemporary styled homes are confined to the outer edges of the community. Since they were not built as part of the original subdivision and are of a later period architectural style, they are not included within the boundary of the Arlington Forest Historic District. In 1950 and 1951, an enclave of one-story brick homes called Forest Park on South Edison Street was designed as prototypes for M.T. Broyhill Homes and built for Broyhill employees. Ten brick ramblers were constructed in 1956 on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North, just east of Henderson Road. Four brick ramblers located on North Carlin Springs Road adjacent to the western edge of Arlington Forest were constructed in 1958.

Another group of seven split-levels was constructed on the historic Mary Carlin property at North Carlin Springs Road and 1<sup>st</sup> Place North in 1967 and 1968.

### **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Arlington Forest is one of Arlington County's best-executed examples of a planned, mixeduse subdivision that evolved in distinct phases before, during, and after World War II. It contains a collection of detached single-family homes, a neighborhood shopping center, three public parks, and several community facilities. Arlington Forest is especially significant for its interpretation of the national subdivision trends and neighborhood planning techniques that emerged during the mid-20th century as a result of New Deal programs, the innovative philosophies and programs advocated by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA), and the increasing demand for housing in the Washington, DC, region. The original platted subdivision, begun in 1939 and completed in 1946, is the only known project in Arlington County built by Meadowbrook, Inc., a leading mid-20th century operative builder in the metropolitan Washington, DC, area under the direction of Monroe Warren. Meadowbrook collaborated with locally prominent architect Robert O. Scholz to design modest-sized twostory, brick homes with minimal Colonial Revival detailing differentiated by alternating roof shapes, placement of main entrances and porches, and use of materials. Warren and Scholz modeled their Arlington Forest subdivision upon the recommended design standards and financial incentives established by the FHA, tailoring several FHA house designs and construction principles to create a uniform, desirable, and restricted neighborhood of quality affordable homes. The design of the subdivision typifies the basic tenets of mid-20<sup>th</sup> century neighborhood planning, with ample lot sizes, tree-lined curvilinear streets and cul-de-sacs, open parklands, a neighborhood shopping center, and restrictive ownership covenants. In 1948, the last section of the Arlington Forest subdivision called Broyhill's Addition was completed by another well-known regional builder, M.T. Broyhill & Sons. Besides being among some of the first homes built by the firm in the DC area, Broyhill & Sons teamed with local architect J. Raymond Mims for their project. Compatible to Meadowbrook's original homes in materials, form, and architectural style, the design of Broyhill's Addition also reflects the building standards and community planning techniques promoted by the FHA.

The Arlington Forest Historic District meets National Register criteria A and C and is significant under the themes of community planning/development and architecture. Its period of significance extends from 1939 to 1948. The Arlington Forest Historic District contains 813 single-family detached dwellings, one neighborhood shopping center, three public parks, and 289 secondary resources such as garages and sheds. Forest Historic District contains 813 contributing resources and 293 non-contributing resources.

## Criterion A: That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history.

Arlington Forest meets Criterion A of the National Register of Historic Places as one of Arlington County's earliest and best examples of a planned, mixed-use, mid-20<sup>th</sup> century community. In addition to the 802 detached, single-family residences, other integral components of the neighborhood's design include a shopping center, open public parklands, and assorted community facilities. The Arlington Forest subdivision -- from its initial planning stages, design and construction phases, through the execution of marketing and sales -- is an archetypal community that evolved and succeeded as a result of popular planning trends of the era in which it was built.

Three such trends in particular, including the Better Homes and Small House movements, the Neighborhood Unit Formula devised by Clarence Perry, and then later the Federal Housing Administration programs created during the New Deal era, are manifested in both the planning and architecture of Arlington Forest. The Better Homes movement encouraged builders to construct homes designed by professional architects and that incorporated variety in their design. Through the Small House Architects' Bureau and other similar designing committees nationwide, house designs and specifications were created, published, and even sold to builders. Two particular Colonial-styled designs of the 1920s Better Homes movement, John Floyd Yewell's 1922 award-winning model in New York and a 1929 Bureau design, likely influenced Meadowbrook's planning for the modest architecture of Arlington Forest. Influences from Perry's Neighborhood Unit Formula also are evident in the neighborhood's large size, inclusion of recreational and open space, curvilinear circulation patterns lined with trees and featuring cul-de-sacs throughout, centrally-located community facilities to serve the neighborhood, and a compatible neighborhood shopping center at the outskirts along commuter U.S. Route 50 (Arlington Boulevard).

Yet the innovative building philosophies and standards established by the FHA's Land Planning Division had the most direct impact upon the creation and sustainability of the Arlington Forest subdivision. Meadowbrook, along with project architect Robert O. Scholz,

incorporated both the minimum requirements and desirable standards advocated by the FHA to ensure the development of an appealing, quality, and affordable neighborhood of single-family detached homes. Even beyond their adoption of such basic design principles as adapting the site layout to the natural topography and providing ample-sized lots on long blocks with utilities provided, they also capitalized on the financial incentives offered by the FHA. By reducing the purchase price of its homes in order to meet FHA financing requirements, Meadowbrook maximized FHA benefits by receiving mortgage insurance for its Arlington Forest venture, while simultaneously attracting potential home buyers in the local middle class market. The combination of comfortable, modern homes on tree-lined streets in proximity to neighboring park lands, shopping, community facilities, and the Nation's Capital undoubtedly made Arlington Forest an attractive and viable community during the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, a role which continues today.

Additionally, two separate teams of builders and architects -- Meadowbrook with Robert O. Scholz by 1938 and Broyhill & Sons with J. Raymond Mims in 1948 -- worked to build the Arlington Forest project. This type of joint effort between builder and architect was quite unusual for the time period, considering most metropolitan areas did not yet have large-scale tract housing projects and subdivisions designed with the assistance of an architect until the late-1940s into the early-1950s. Such collaborations especially thrived in the Washington, DC, area since architects were lured to the region to help meet the housing demands brought on by the area's phenomenal population growth between the Great Depression to after World War II. This partnership of builder and architect allowed for improved building design and resulted in providing "custom character at the mass level." Arlington Forest clearly embodies this type of individualized standardization, as illustrated by the repetitiveness of its basic building footprint and slight variations in roof shape, entrance and porch locations, use of materials, and varied Colonial Revival detailing. Furthermore, rather than creating new styles or designs, both teams of builders and architects relied on the popular FHA house designs and planning principles of the era and adapted them for use within Arlington Forest.

Criterion C: That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.

Arlington Forest is one of the first large-tract, suburban-type, residential detached housing developments in both Arlington County and the greater Washington, DC, metropolitan area. As a predecessor of Levittown, New York, Arlington Forest is comprised of buildings based on one basic design and floor plan repeated with slight variations throughout the community. The architecture of Arlington Forest, both modest in mass and simple in ornamentation, was directly inspired by specific house designs created and popularized by the Land Planning Division of the Federal Housing Administration in 1936. By using the two-story House Types C, D, and E as their inspiration, Meadowbrook and architect Robert O. Scholz created nine different house variations within Arlington Forest. Their adaptations and variations, though subtle in their execution, involved modifying the orientation of entrances and porches, incorporating various porches, roofs, and decorative detailing, and including a full unfinished basement and three bedrooms in each home. The completion of Broyhill's Addition in 1948 added yet one more house type to the original neighborhood, though still consistent and compatible in form, materials, massing, and minimal style.

Beyond the basic appearance of the homes, the architecture of Arlington Forest also incorporates the forward-thinking FHA philosophies that emerged in 1940 to encourage the flexibility of interior and exterior space, yet still allow for both variety and expandability. This new approach to house design and construction considered how the orientation of homes was affected by wind and sunlight, how interior spaces could be enlarged, as well as how to introduce standardization into the planning and building processes. Incorporating basements, fireplaces, and chimneys as standard building features became common practice, as did the standardization of construction and finishing materials. Through standardization, variations of the same basic house plans could be created simply by reversing floor plans, or alternating exterior materials, entrances, or roof types. Meadowbrook and Scholz adopted these techniques throughout Arlington Forest, making use of such tactics in the Southside section, already well underway in 1939 even before such trends emerged in the popular mainstream. Meadowbrook's use of such uniform home designs also allowed for a quicker and more cost effective construction process. While the house designs maintain an obvious

level of homogeneity, the homes themselves reflect a distinct level of differentiation achieved through the varying use of roof shapes, locations of entrances and porches, and types of materials and detailing used.

Instead of breaking away from the traditional building practices and stylistic preferences predominant in the mid-20th century, both teams of builders and architects responsible for the construction of Arlington Forest were guided by the popular trends in house design of the period, particularly those standards and designs advocated by the FHA. The metropolitan Washington, DC, area in general, and Arlington County specifically, boasts a substantial preand post-World War II residential housing stock of brick construction, especially with Colonial Revival detailing.<sup>4</sup> The Colonial Revival style and building forms were especially preferred in the speculative building market because of their traditional qualities and appeal.<sup>5</sup> Many residential projects, from subdivisions of single-family homes to complexes of multifamily garden apartment buildings, commonly used characteristic elements such as brick, symmetrical facades, and gable roofs. The popularity of the Colonial Revival style often also is attributed to the general fascination with American history and heritage that emerged during the 1920s and 1930s. The abundance of 18th and 19th century brick buildings and rowhouses in the neighboring City of Alexandria, Georgetown, and throughout Washington, DC, as well as the region's proximity to the restored colonial capital of Williamsburg, also likely contributed to a regional fondness for the Colonial Revival style. In addition, many residential projects that initially received generous financial support from the FHA reflected such traditional architecture that was widely accepted and popular during this period, as opposed to more modern and more austere designs. The simple square building form of the Arlington Forest homes, combined with their minimal degree of Colonial Revival ornamentation, can be attributed to the mass production approach of the subdivision to meet the growing local housing need.

Arlington Forest also is a prime example of the types of large-scale housing developments that were built to satisfy the incredible housing demand during the pre- and post-World War II period. Between 1940 and 1950, the suburban areas of Virginia grew at an amazing rate of 130 percent, compared to 107 percent in Maryland and 21 percent in the District of Columbia. During this same decade, Arlington County alone experienced a growth rate of 138 percent. Even with a total area of just 24 square miles, Arlington County was rated the ninth fastest growing suburban county in the entire nation between 1940 and 1957. The

rural outlying suburban areas all throughout the region were especially appealing to prospective home buyers, many of whom were employed by the Federal government in Washington, DC, and were willing to commute the reasonable distance to work. Likewise, these same suburban areas were appealing to local builders and developers since costs for land and construction were not as high as in central Washington.

### **Historical Background**

Native Americans were the earliest inhabitants of the area today known as Arlington Forest. Artifacts from 8,500 years ago have been found along Four Mile Run, and a village site has been identified at the confluence of Four Mile Run and Long Branch. During the 18<sup>th</sup> century, several large colonial land grants shared a common border at this same location. In close proximity, George Washington, who owned a parcel of land south of this point along Four Mile Run, marked the junction with a large oak tree. A marble pillar in Glencarlyn Park marks Washington's survey point and a section of the old oak tree is visible in Glencarlyn Library.

Most of the land that is now Arlington Forest was owned by John Colville, a British merchant and planter who owned trading ships along the Potomac in the early-1730s. According to his will, Colville purchased a 1,400-acre Lubber Branch tract on Four Mile Run in 1731. In addition to being an active land speculator in both Maryland and Virginia, he also was involved in area politics. Colville was appointed to the Virginia Assembly in 1743, served as a justice in Prince William and Fairfax counties, and was a trustee of Alexandria. In 1754, Colville received permission to build a water grist mill on Lubber Run just above Four Mile Run. Several other grist mills were later built along the "Fall Line," the major geologic boundary between the crystalline metamorphic and igneous rocks of the Piedmont and the sedimentary rocks of the Atlantic coastal plain. In 1772, William Carlin purchased 165 acres on the northern side of Four Mile Run that was part of Colville's Lubber Run Tract. Carlin's parcel included the land of Mary A. Carlin, the Paullin and Alexander tracts, and a large portion of the Henderson estate.

In 1847, construction began along Four Mile Run for the Washington & Old Dominion (W&OD) Railway, extending from Alexandria to Bluemont in the Blue Ridge Mountains. <sup>12</sup> Water from Four Mile Run was used to fill train boilers. During the Civil War, train

engineers frequently complained that their boilers overflowed with soap suds since thousands of Union soldiers washed their clothes in the water supply. During the Battle of Falls Church, a minor skirmish occurred in Lubber Run.

By 1872, the Carlin Springs area boasted two natural springs and remained a thriving recreational resort for two decades. John Carlin built two large pavilions at the natural spring along Four Mile Run above its confluence with "Lovers Run" (present-day Lubber Run). Visitors from neighboring Alexandria and Washington, DC, were lured by a dance hall, a 250-seat restaurant and ice cream parlor, and swimming holes reputed to be the best in Arlington County. During the winter months, the swimming holes were popular ice skating venues. The W&OD Railroad remained a popular commuter line through the early-20<sup>th</sup> century, and passengers continued to ride the "Virginia Creeper" until it ceased operation in 1941. Freight and mail service continued until the railroad was disbanded in 1968. Today, the railroad right-of-way forms the popular W&OD Regional Trail, a section of which extends through Arlington Forest.

According to the 1878 Hopkins Map of Alexandria County, Virginia, the area of Lubber Run that now contains Arlington Forest was occupied by only two families, William Cipher [or Sypher] and Charles Mix. By the advent of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, most of the land now within the Arlington Forest subdivision was associated with the locally prominent Henderson family. In 1893 and 1894, John B. Henderson, Jr. purchased three adjoining properties totaling 134 acres. His father, the elder Henderson, served as a United States Senator from Missouri from 1862 to 1869, authored the 13<sup>th</sup> Amendment to the Constitution, and was a key figure in keeping Missouri in the Union. John, Jr., had an equally impressive professional career as a lawyer and diplomat, as well as having a great interest in marine biology and published technical papers on specimens collected from Maine to the West Indies and Hawaii. He also succeeded his father as a Regent of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, DC.

Though the family's primary residence remained at their Henderson "castle" on 16<sup>th</sup> Street, NW, in Washington, DC (this building no longer stands), John Henderson, Jr., built a country estate in 1894 on land at the northern edge of what is now Arlington Forest in Arlington County. The large, two-story, Tudor-styled home featured elaborate frame half-timbering. The estate also included a barn (which burned in 1952), a caretaker's house, carriage house,

and other outbuildings. A tree-lined stone driveway led out to Henderson Road. After Henderson's death in 1923, patent lawyer Herbert Porter purchased the house and six acres of land. Between 1941 and 1950, the estate was used as an officers' club by the U.S. Army. Arlington County purchased the estate in 1951 and converted the home for use as a recreation center. The estate was destroyed by an electrical fire during Hurricane Hazel on October 16, 1954. The current Lubber Run Recreation Center replaced the original Henderson home. No traces of the Henderson family estate remain.

There are three extant 19th century houses located within the Arlington Forest neighborhood, two of which are within the boundaries of the Arlington Forest Historic District. Just outside the western edge of the district at 5512 North Carlin Springs Road is the Mary Carlin House. Constructed circa 1800 by William Carlin, the tailor of George Washington, the one-story log home originally was part of his 165-acre tract purchased in 1772. Carlin later gave the property to his granddaughters, Mary and Ann Carlin. Mary Carlin was born in the house circa 1805 and resided there until her death in 1905. Broyhill's Addition within the Arlington Forest Historic District contains the other two 19<sup>th</sup> century homes. The one-story Ann Carlin cottage, located at 117 North Galveston Street, is believed to have been built around 1850 as a tenant house or servants' quarters. Lastly, the two-story, frame farmhouse at 205 North Galveston Street likely dates from the 1820s to 1840s. During the Civil War, this property was owned by Charles E. Mix, Commissioner of Indian Affairs. When Mix filed a claim for damages caused by Union troops in 1861 and 1862, his property inventory included the house, a barn and hay barrack, an ice and meat house, a root house, a spring house, a blacksmith shop, an overseer's house, a kitchen, and a barn and hen house. In addition to the dwelling, only an early carriage house survives and now serves as the garage of the neighboring home at 5329 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North.

Following the death of Mrs. John B. Henderson, nearly all of the remaining Henderson tract not previously sold to Herbert Porter was sold to Thomas H. Pickford in 1930. Six years later, Pickford sold his land to the development firm of Robert E. Heater Associates, Inc., who planned to build a subdivision called Parmelee on the site now occupied by Arlington Forest. The neighborhood was to be named in honor of William R. Parmelee, the president of the Toledo Guaranty Corporation providing the necessary financing. An early description of Parmelee boasted its ideal location 305 feet above sea level, ½-mile west of the intersection of Glebe Road and Lee (Arlington) Boulevard, and only 3½ miles from

downtown Washington, DC. The macadam streets were to measure from 50 to 60 feet in width and the lots between 75 to 110 feet in frontage and 120 to 250 feet in depth. Such modern conveniences as electricity, water, gas, sewers, and street lighting also were advertised. By the summer of 1936, many lots already had been sold and the developer claimed that applications for home sites were arriving at its office daily. Construction was expected to begin within the upcoming weeks and anticipated to be completed by the fall of 1936. Little else is known about the initial plans for the Parmelee community, other than it never materialized. A series of problems ultimately prevented its construction, and the parcel was purchased in 1938 by another developer, Meadowbrook, Inc. 17

### Monroe Warren and Meadowbrook Construction Company, Inc.

Under the direction of its president Monroe Warren, the Meadowbrook Construction Company was an active building and real estate development firm in the metropolitan Washington, DC, area between the 1910s to the mid-1950s. Meadowbrook can be classified as an "operative builder" in that it assumed complete control of its projects, from the initial planning, platting, and designing, to hiring skilled workers and overseeing the construction phases, to the handling of financing and sales efforts. With the revitalization of the home building industry in the mid-1930s spurred by the initiatives of the New Deal (such as the FHA), operative builders could obtain FHA-approved private financing for their large-scale neighborhood developments. Operative builders also realized that the economics of the period called for incorporating the philosophies and techniques of standardization, mass production, and prefabrication into their projects in order to decrease construction costs and quicken the pace of construction.

Meadowbrook Construction Company's developed projects ranged from high-rise apartment buildings such as the Kennedy-Warren, Tilden Gardens, and Chevy Chase Lake apartments, to single-family homes in Woodley Gardens in Rockville, Maryland and the Leland community in Bethesda, Maryland.<sup>20</sup> In addition to Arlington Forest, which is the only known Meadowbrook-built community in Arlington County, Virginia, other prominent projects included the developments of Meadowbrook (Chevy Chase, Maryland), Grasslands (Northwest Washington, DC), Fairlawn Village (Southeast Washington, DC), and Landover Hills (Prince George's County, Maryland).<sup>21</sup> The media claimed that the Meadowbrook firm "set a new standard in fine home construction,"<sup>22</sup> and promotional literature distributed by

the company maintained it was responsible for the planning, building, and sale of "over 2,000 homes of quality and character built in Washington and vicinity." Warren strived to meet the needs of prospective home buyers by creating "restricted and controlled communit[ies] at a price in keeping with reduced incomes."

Of the four other mid-20<sup>th</sup> century subdivisions attributed to Monroe Warren and his firm, the earliest bears the company's name. Plans for Meadowbrook, a restricted subdivision of more than 400 detached homes on 70 acres, were announced formally on June 20, 1930.<sup>25</sup> Located in Chevy Chase, Maryland, the community is bounded by the Columbia Country Club to the north and east, Aspen Street to the south, and Leland Street and Cypress Avenue to the west. The architecture featured a variety of designs, predominantly of the Colonial and English styles. All lots were completely sodded, landscaped, and included a formal garden. David J. Howell & Son served as project engineers, Parks & Baxter as the architects, and John H. Small, III, as landscape architect. By eliminating all overhead charges and accepting a very small profit margin, the developer could offer homes built to plan starting at \$10,750.<sup>26</sup> At least one exhibit home is known, located at 7104 Chatham Road.<sup>27</sup>

Meadowbrook announced its Grasslands development on November 4, 1934. Consisting of 60 homes, this neighborhood is located in Northwest Washington, DC. Five homes at the intersection of 44<sup>th</sup> and Yuma streets, NW, were among the first to be completed. Described as "the first highly restricted project of detached homes offered in Washington at a price under \$10,000," Grasslands boasts the same quality of construction and materials used in the more expensive Meadowbrook development. Project architect Harvey P. Baxter designed the houses, most in the early American and Colonial styles. Other amenities included white picket fences, formal rear gardens, flagstone walkways, and generous landscaping. At least two exhibit homes, 4301 43<sup>rd</sup> Street, NW, <sup>29</sup> and 4400 44<sup>th</sup> Street, NW, <sup>30</sup> have been identified to date.

Meadowbrook's planned community of Fairlawn Village in Southeast Washington, DC, was one of the District's fastest selling residential neighborhoods, with 285 homes sold in just 22 months by spring 1940.<sup>31</sup> The project would eventually contain 400 brick residences, most semi-detached. Costs of the five- and six-room homes began at \$5,450, with monthly payments starting at just \$35.74. At least one exhibit home has been identified, located at 1952 U Place, SE.

Unlike the three preceding subdivisions completed by Meadowbrook, the Landover Hills development most resembles Arlington Forest. Undoubtedly, the success of the Arlington Forest subdivision influenced the architectural design and layout of Landover Hills, which is situated on 148 acres along Defense Highway (Maryland Route 450) in Prince George's County, Maryland, midway between Bladensburg and Lanham.<sup>32</sup> Monroe Warren and his wife Dorothy began plans for the subdivision in 1940, even as the construction of Arlington Forest was well under way. That same year, the two-story, frame, single-family houses with side entrances became available to potential buyers for approximately \$3,000 to \$4,000 each. One and one-half-story frame Cape Cods, also with side entrances, were the other prominent house type in this community. Construction continued into at least 1943, with homes selling for \$5,575 with a \$200 minimum down payment required for purchase.<sup>33</sup> At least one exhibit home is known, located at 4112 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. Similarities to Arlington Forest are evident in several respects, including its wooded setting, modest Colonial-styled architecture with the same basic form and layout, though the Landover Hills homes are all of frame construction not masonry and feature mainly side entrances with frame entrance porches. A site visit to the Landover Hills community revealed that its original architectural integrity has been severely compromised by an abundance of replacement materials, including vinyl and aluminum siding, permastone, and vinyl and other windows.

Monroe Warren also was active in the Home Builders Association of Metropolitan Washington (HBAMW), which was founded in 1924 by real estate developers Herbert T. Shannon and Waverly Taylor of Shannon & Luchs Construction Company. Originally named the Operative Builders Association of the District of Columbia, the name changed to HBAMW in 1941. The Board of Directors and Past President's Council of the HBAMW were comprised of some of the leading developers and builders in the region in the period before and after World War II. Monroe Warren served on the HBAMW Board of Directors from 1928 to 1930 and served as the third president of the organization. Warren later served on the Past Presidents' Council in 1960.

### **Arlington Forest and the Federal Housing Administration**

In their planning for Arlington Forest, Meadowbrook and Scholz relied upon the popular national trends in subdivision planning and design as their inspiration. As early as the 1920s and 1930s, both the Better Homes and the Small Houses movements began to promote

houses of six rooms or less designed by professional architects.<sup>35</sup> The Small House Architects' Bureau in particular, founded in 1919 in Minneapolis, was a non-profit organization of architects nationwide who sold both designs and technical specifications to builders of small homes. The Bureau advocated introducing variety in design by reversing floor plans, varying roof shapes, and interchanging entrances. A six-room, two-story Colonial Revival home in Larchmont Gardens, New York, was deemed the 1922 "Better Homes Week" home for New York City and appeared the next year in The Books of a Thousand Homes by architect/editor Henry Atterbury Smith. This award-winning model, designed by architect John Floyd Yewell, had a center-hall plan, plain side porches with shed roofs, different types of siding between the two stories, and second floor windows that ended at the top plate for the roof and whose proportions were shorter than the first floor window openings. In comparison, Meadowbrook's Arlington Forest home was a simplified version of Yewell's model with side entrances, with similar side porches, combinations of exterior materials, smaller second story windows, no interior hallways, and smaller room sizes. Another house design, a Georgian Revival-styled home published several years later in the Bureau's 1929 Small Homes of Architectural Distinction, also resembles the typical Arlington Forest house. Popular magazines of the era, such as Better Homes and Gardens, American Home, and McCall's, also appealed to home builders and owners alike with their featured small house designs, articles about home improvement and interior decoration, and advertisements for the newest manufactured products.36

Even with such house designs readily available in the 1920s, the ultimate measure of success attained through the design and planning of the Arlington Forest subdivision can be attributed directly to those building standards and financial incentives advocated by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). To help stimulate the building industry and encourage private investment in the housing market, the FHA was created under the National Housing Act of 1934.<sup>37</sup> Specific priorities included developing housing standards, a real estate appraisal process, and a review program for approving proposed subdivisions for Federal mortgage insurance. Obtaining FHA approval not only allowed developers to secure private financing for their single- and multiple-family home projects, but also allowed their prospective home buyers to secure low-cost mortgages. Under the direction of Seward H. Mott in the Land Planning Division, the FHA established written standards that could be applied nationwide to both neighborhood planning and subdivision review. With titles such as *Planning Neighborhoods for Small Houses* and *Successful Subdivisions*, the FHA issued a

series of publications between 1936 and 1940 that highlighted suggested planning principles and featured actual house designs.

Builders and prospective buyers alike praised the benefits of FHA's revolutionary plan for the purchasing and financing of homes. Previously, buyers needed to furnish upfront up to fifty percent of the purchase price in cash in order to avoid financing an expensive second trust. With the new FHA program, buyers needed only twenty percent of the purchase price as a cash down payment directly to the builder, with the FHA guaranteeing the remaining eighty percent of the property's value in just one mortgage amortized over twenty years. In 1938, mortgage insurance could be extended to as much as ninety percent of the building's value, with the amortization period extendable to twenty-five years. The loans required no renewal fees and were payable at reasonable monthly rates, which included payments on principal, interest, taxes, and insurance. Builders could take advantage of periodic inspections of their construction progress by FHA officials, resulting in increased confidence of consumers and those institutions involved in the financing aspect of the project.

The building industry skyrocketed in an attempt to satisfy the national demand for housing and to take advantage of these innovative FHA incentives for home buyers. In 1933, housing starts nationwide amounted to only 93,000; by 1939, national housing starts and sales totaled 458,000, with numbers steadily rising to 530,000 in 1940 and 619,000 in 1941. In 1939 alone, more than 2,600 subdivisions (equivalent to about 300,000 building lots) were processed by technicians in FHA's Land Planning Division. 41 And by 1940, nearly 45 percent of all new home construction nationwide was executed under FHA's financing plan. 42 During its first four decades of operation, the FHA provided more than \$119 billion in mortgage insurance, primarily in suburban areas.<sup>43</sup> Of all the FHA commitments in the Washington, DC, area, at least two-thirds were located in the outlying suburbs, including Arlington County and Alexandria in Virginia and Silver Spring, Takoma Park, Chevy Chase, University Park, Westmoreland Hills, and West Haven in Maryland. 44 The flurry of building activity occurring in Arlington alone can be attributed to the dramatic increase in population. The population rose a remarkable 47 percent between 1930 and 1940, with 57,040 residents in the County by 1940.<sup>45</sup> Of those Arlingtonians employed in 1940, more than 40 percent were local, state, or federal government workers. 46 By 1944, Arlington's population skyrocketed to 120,000 residents, due primarily to America's entry into World War II. 47

Meadowbrook President Monroe Warren was an enthusiastic advocate of the new FHA financing plan. He hailed the plan as "the most forward step that has been taken in the last generation in helping the purchasers of homes." By mid-1935, to insure that his potential customers could take advantage of the FHA program, Warren reduced the purchase price of each of Meadowbrook's homes by \$500 in order to meet FHA financing requirements. By doing so, the company avoided paying for any second trust discounts and had completed new homes purchased within just weeks.

To receive FHA approval for mortgage lending and mutual mortgage insurance, new subdivisions had to meet seven minimum requirements. These conditions practically became standards in the nationwide building industry for home construction. <sup>49</sup> The standards promoted the creation of neighborhoods that were safe, self-contained, and comprised of low-cost homes that were small, yet efficient. <sup>50</sup> In essence, the standards institutionalized the suburban ideal in America. Several popular design concepts of the era directly influenced the formulation of the FHA minimum standards, including the prevailing theories of city planning and landscape design, the garden city movement, curvilinear street models, new advances in subdivision and zoning regulation, and the Neighborhood Unit Concept developed by Clarence Perry. Characteristics of Perry's neighborhood formula in particular are apparent in the Arlington Forest subdivision, considering the neighborhood's large size, reservation of recreational and open space, tree-lined curvilinear street patterns with cul-desacs, centrally-located community facilities, and a shopping center at the edge of the neighborhood near the main arterial road (Arlington Boulevard/U.S. Route 50). <sup>51</sup>

The minimum FHA requirements included: a location with a proven demand for houses; a location with suitable topography, soil, tree cover, and that is free from environmental hazards; accessibility by public transportation and sufficient highway access to community services; installation of necessary street improvements and utilities; compliance with local zoning and subdivision regulations to ensure the stability of the neighborhood and its property values; creating deed restrictions for minimum construction costs, lot sizes, and building setbacks to strengthen property values; and guaranteeing not only the financial soundness of the developers to execute their sales and development program, but also the stability of assessments and taxes. <sup>52</sup> The FHA also created eight additional "desirable standards" that influenced project approval. These standards suggested: adapting the site layout to natural topography and features; adjusting street plans, widths, and grades to

accommodate traffic needs; eliminating sharp street corners and dangerous intersections; using long blocks to eliminate unneeded streets; providing well-shaped and ample-sized lots; incorporating playgrounds and parks; establishing community organizations of property owners; and including features to promote the attractiveness and privacy of the neighborhood.

Meadowbrook incorporated each of these innovations of early-20<sup>th</sup> century residential design and planning into its Arlington Forest development. Additionally, parallel service roads along Arlington Boulevard and a buffer park strip along either side of the highway were integral parts of the design during a time when land use planning was virtually nonexistent in Arlington County.<sup>53</sup> It is even reputed that Arlington Forest was the first project in Virginia to use these two tactics in a residential development.<sup>54</sup> Arlington Forest also was the first subdivision in the County to lay power and telephone lines in backyards rather than on the street.<sup>55</sup>

The natural setting of the Arlington Forest neighborhood also contributes to its overall character. The curvilinear streets provide an aesthetic setting for the homes and follow the natural terrain of the area. In keeping with FHA design standards, this curvilinear layout emphasizes the use of cul-de-sacs and minor residential streets that are linked to collector streets and perimeter access roads such as Arlington Boulevard and North Carlin Springs Road. Meadowbrook incorporated such a layout to allow for long blocks of evenly-sized lots and streets of various widths that discouraged congestion and through-traffic. Trees also continue to be important natural and visual aspects of the Arlington Forest community, as its name implies. During the construction phase, developer Meadowbrook, Inc., made an effort to preserve two trees in the front yard of each house when possible. 56 Those houses that were built in open fields had trees planted in their front yards. Builder Monroe Warren even donated several tracts of land for incorporation into Lubber Run Park, which continues to serve as a fundamental part of the community. In the 1940s, Warren also requested that a large holly tree be relocated from the middle of what is now North Park Drive and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North to the traffic circle at the entrance to the Arlington Forest Shopping Center. This tree served as the neighborhood's official outdoor Christmas tree until the annual tree-lighting ceremony was moved in the 1980s near the Lubber Run Recreation Center.

Meadowbrook established 13 restrictive covenants for its Arlington Forest subdivision, as was a common national practice of residential development during this period. According to the original covenants for Arlington Forest, all lots, with the exception of those parcels designated for the centrally-located shopping center, were to be for residential use.<sup>57</sup> The only types of structures permitted to be built on each residential lot were a detached singlefamily dwelling less than 21/2-stories in height and a private garage large enough for no more than two cars. Dwellings also were required to cost at least \$3,000 and satisfy minimum square footage requirements on the ground floor depending on the overall height of the house. Only persons of Caucasian descent were to use or occupy any building or lot, with the exception of domestic servants of a different race who resided with property owners or tenants. Additional restrictions pertained to building set backs, lot sizes, the location and use of outbuildings, utility easements, disposal of refuse, procedures for constructing new or altering existing buildings, and how to report violations of the covenants. The Arlington Forest covenants originally were intended to remain in effect until January 1, 1970, at which point they could be renewed or revised at ten-year intervals with the majority vote of the property owners. Throughout the 1930s and 1940s, FHA-insured communities especially were encouraged to use such restrictions in order to help protect and maintain property values and neighborhood stability.<sup>58</sup> The restrictions could be enforced by civil law suits brought to local courts by property owners within a subdivision.<sup>59</sup> Not until 1948, with the case of Shelley vs. Kraemer, did the U.S. Supreme Court determine that racial restrictions would no longer be enforceable.<sup>60</sup>

Neighborhood folklore contends that Arlington Forest was featured in an issue of *Life* magazine as a model example of a residential development. However, research conducted to date failed to substantiate this claim. An aerial photograph of the Arlington Forest subdivision was featured on the cover of a July 1960 issue of a U.S. government Housing and Home Finance Agency publication entitled *Suggested Land Subdivision Regulations*. Promotional literature published by Meadowbrook boasted that the Arlington Forest community was approved for financing from the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). Unfortunately, the examination of FHA annual reports and other historic records as part of the research for this nomination did not reveal specific information about Meadowbrook's application or approval for FHA financing for Arlington Forest. This is mainly because only selected records of the Land Planning Division were maintained within the Federal Housing Administration's main collection (Record Group 31) at the National Archives in Washington,

DC.<sup>64</sup> Evidence found to date that details FHA's role in the financial backing of the subdivision is limited at best. Several real estate advertisements from the period found in *The Washington Post* describe Arlington Forest as an FHA community. An article detailing the benefits of controlled neighborhood planning, written by Seward H. Mott, the Director of the FHA's Land Planning Division, also was found in the November 1940 edition of *Architectural Record*. This article featured a photograph of the intersection of South Columbus and South Buchanan streets.<sup>65</sup> The caption described Arlington Forest as "an FHA community that has grown uniformly since 1939."

Research for this nomination also discovered nine historic black and white photographic images in the Farm Security Administration - Office of War Information Collection (1935-1945) of the Library of Congress. This collection highlights Americans at home, work, and play, emphasizing rural and small town life; the negative effects of the Great Depression, the Dust Bowl, and farm mechanization; and the nation's mobilization effort for World War II. All of the Arlington Forest photographs were labeled simply "Arlington, Virginia. Subdivision under construction" and taken by photographer John Collier in May 1942. The photographs depict completed streetscapes in the Greenbrier section of Arlington Forest, as well as various unidentified homes under construction. The streetscape views are readily identifiable even today and are remarkably similar to modern views, with the exception of the tree canopy that has matured over the decades. See Figures 2 through 9 to compare several of these historic images with their modern-day views.

### **Arlington Forest Citizens Association**

The origins of the Arlington Forest Citizens Association (AFCA) date to 1940, when a group of original neighborhood residents first met to consider forming a citizens organization. It was hoped that such an organization would help residents and neighbors to become acquainted, as well as provide a forum for speaking out on behalf of the neighborhood and County. The lead organizer and first provisional president was William C. Tucker. Mrs. Frank S. Bruffey served as secretary during the organizational meetings and the Association's constitution and by-laws were written by Elton Layton, D.C. Scott Daniel, and Sylvester (Bob) Keesee. In January 1941, the Arlington Forest Citizens Association was formally established, with the first official officers elected during a meeting held at the

Woman's Club of Ashton Heights. These first officers included President D.C. Scott Daniel, Vice-President Daniel R. Dundon, Secretary Mrs. Bruffey, and Treasurer Thomas S. Schull. Since its founding, the AFCA has maintained an active community presence. It continues to hold regular monthly meetings the third Wednesday of the month, except during June, July, August, and December. The meetings have occurred in numerous locations over the decades, including the Lyon Park Community Center, St. Thomas More Church, Arlington Forest Methodist Church, Lubber Run Recreation Center, and Kate Waller Barrett Elementary School. Meetings strive to satisfy the varied interests of the membership, with topics ranging from neighborhood and County issues to political forums and lectures, and even fine arts performances. There are more than 800 households in the AFCA, with each household having one vote. The Association is also a member of the Arlington County Civic Federation, comprised of 61 neighborhood associations Countywide.

The Association also sponsors a range of neighborhood activities, such as an annual picnic in June and the annual Christmas tree lighting ceremony in December. Each month the Association publishes and delivers *The Arlington Forester* newsletter to each household. With its humble beginnings in 1942 as an oversized postal card, the newsletter is reputedly the oldest continuously published neighborhood newsletter in Arlington County. The AFCA also supports and maintains a community Internet website.

### Verbal Boundary Description

The subdivision of Arlington Forest is located in central Arlington County, Virginia. It is situated to the immediate south of the Bluemont neighborhood, with the Glencarlyn neighborhood abutting to the southwest and the Barcroft neighborhood adjacent to the southeast. The Arlington Forest Historic District extends from North Carlin Springs Road and North George Mason Drive to the north to South Columbus and South Aberdeen streets to the south. Arlington Boulevard (U.S. Route 50) bisects the district and separates the northern and southern halves of the neighborhood. Originally called Lee Boulevard and now more commonly known as U.S. Route 50, Arlington Boulevard was completed by the mid-1930s. This thoroughfare continues to be a major commuter route into Washington, DC, for the residents of Arlington Forest and neighboring communities alike. Lubber Run Park also bisects the district, separating the western and eastern halves of the subdivision. To the west, the district boundary follows the rear property lines of those homes along North Granada and North Galveston streets. The eastern boundary of the district follows the western side of North Henderson Road. The Arlington Forest Historic District contains 219.15 acres.

### **Boundary Justification**

The boundaries of the Arlington Forest Historic District encompass the original 1939 platting of the subdivision by Meadowbrook Construction Company, Inc., and includes all of the distinct phases of Meadowbrook development that continued through 1946. Also included is Broyhill's Addition to Arlington Forest, which is adjacent to the original subdivision on the west and completed in 1948 by M.T. Broyhill & Sons. Those properties within Broyhill's Addition are included in the Historic District because the architecture is reminiscent of the designs of original developer/builder Monroe Warren and architect Robert O. Scholz, as well as based upon the



same principles of FHA subdivision planning and principles of house design incorporated by Meadowbrook. Of the 219 acres within the Historic District, only approximately 14 acres are part of Broyhill's Addition.

The southern-most boundaries of the Arlington Forest Historic District lie south of Arlington Boulevard between South Columbus and South Aberdeen streets. Known as Southside, this section of Arlington Forest was the first to be platted, with construction starting in 1939 and continuing through 1940. West of Southside and west of Glencarlyn Park is a separate enclave of one-story, detached brick ramblers known as Forest Park. This small subdivision on South Edison Street is not included within the Arlington Forest Historic District because it was completed in 1950-1951, and the dwellings' architectural style and massing are not consistent with the neighboring two-story, square-shaped homes of Arlington Forest completed by both Meadowbrook and M.T. Broyhill & Sons.

The remaining and majority of the properties in the Arlington Forest Historic District are located off the northern side of Arlington Boulevard in the sections known as Northside, Greenbrier, and Broyhill's Addition. Northside was completed between 1940-1941 and is situated adjacent to and east of Lubber Run Park. The Greenbrier section was completed in various stages between 1941 and 1946 and is adjacent to and west of Lubber Run Park. Broyhill's Addition was completed in 1948 and is adjacent to the western-most portion of Greenbrier.

Several additional small enclaves of homes dating between 1956 and 1968 border the original subdivision of Arlington Forest and Broyhill's Addition. These more contemporary styled homes are confined to the outer edges of the community. Since they were not built as part of the original subdivision and are of a later period architectural style and form, they are excluded from the boundary of the Arlington Forest Historic District. These include the: ten brick ramblers built in 1956 on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North, just east of Henderson Road; four brick ramblers built in 1958 on North Carlin Springs Road adjacent to Broyhill's Addition; and seven split-levels built in 1967 and 1968 on the historic Mary Carlin property at North Carlin Springs Road and 1<sup>st</sup> Place North. Also excluded from the Historic District boundaries are several individual civic properties that do not contribute to the period of significance, including the Lubber Run Recreation Center, Lubber Run Amphitheatre, and Barrett Elementary School in the northern portion of the neighborhood.




Figure 3: 300 block of North Granada Street and North Greenbrier Street, October 2003 (Photo courtesy of Arlington County Historic Preservation Program)






Figure 9: Construction in Arlington Forest, May 1942. (Photo courtesy of Library of Congress, Prints & Photographs Division, FSA-OWI Collection, LC-USF34-082502-C)
